

Elk and Boxelder Creek Watersheds

ELK CREEK AND BOXELDER CREEK watersheds are often overlooked by anglers as places to fish. Elk Creek is relatively small, with numerous small tribu-

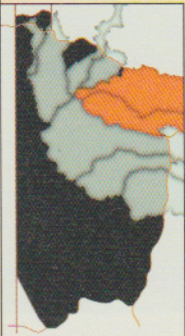
taries containing brook trout. Because of few paved roads in this watershed, fishing pressure is minimal.

Anglers driving Nemo Road will usually find Boxelder Creek dry downstream of the Norris Peak Road. In this area the stream crosses the Madison Limestone formation, and the majority of the stream flows underground and recharges the Madison Aquifer. However, from Norris Peak Road upstream to the old town of Nemo, anglers will find a good brown trout fishery. Most of the smaller tributaries and the stream above Nemo are primarily brook trout waters.
