



DIY FRAMED SUCCULENT

30 min



Supplies

- Succulents
- E.B. Stone™ Cactus Mix
- Wired Wooden Frame
- 25-Year Weed Barrier Fabric
- E.B. Stone™ Green Moss
- Plastic Garbage Bag (optional)
- Staple Gun

Directions

1. Build or repurpose a frame with a depth of at least two inches.
2. Attach chicken wire to the front side of the frame using the staple gun.
3. With wired section facing down, fill the inside with a layer of green moss, then a layer of cactus soil mix.
4. Cut one linear foot of weed barrier and fold into a square so it sufficiently covers the back of the frame. Use staple gun to secure weed barrier backing. If you would like to waterproof your frame for indoor display, staple a layer of plastic over the weed barrier.
5. Flip frame wire side up. Select your succulents, dividing them whenever possible.
6. Plant succulents in the wire frame, and secure with green moss.

Tip

Keep frame horizontal until succulents have taken root, one to two weeks after planting.

Care

Water thoroughly after planting, then mist once or twice a week depending on exposure. Frame can be kept indoors in a brightly lit location. If kept outdoors, place in morning sun or bright shade only, no afternoon sun.
