



DIY PUMPKIN CENTERPIECE

15 min



Supplies

- Pumpkin
- Gloves
- Green moss
- Spray bottle of water for misting
- An assortment of colorful succulent cuttings
- Spray adhesive
- Glue gun

Directions

1. Set pumpkin on newspaper, remove stem.
2. Spray top of pumpkin with adhesive, and quickly stick a one-inch-thick layer of moss on top.
3. Using your warmed-up glue gun, start gluing the cuttings to the pumpkin, applying glue directly to the base of the cutting.

Care

Keep out of direct sun and moisture, bright indirect light is best. Mist weekly and the cuttings will begin to root into the moss. This centerpiece is only a temporary home for the succulents, but it should last for a while because you haven't cut into the pumpkin. Once the pumpkin begins to decompose, slice off the top and plant it in a container to create your own succulent dish garden.

Tip

Put your tallest succulents in the center, and then fill in around them with smaller pieces.
