fast, and ready to give. Playful and practical, tiny pincushions and be-tasseled mini-scissors are meticulously made by the Japanese artisans of *Cohana*. Sweetly old-fashioned, tangy shells of *Sour Fruit Hard Candies* hide mouth-puckering centers! Quick-to-make pompom garlands will tinsel up a tree, mantel, or gifts—cute clipped puffs of *Rowan Big Wool* join juicy, bright *Felt Balls* on twinkling braided ribbon from *Studio Carta*. How sweet it is!



# Marshmallow Magic

The plip of a marshmallow into a mug of cocoa (or perhaps the flump of several) sends us floating through a pink wonderland of all things sweet and fluffy. Our daydreams are brought to life with yarns that are as airy as whipped cream, as pillowy as a sugar puff, as warm as a toasted marshmallow—and thankfully do not result in sticky fingers.

TOASTY: The ribbing and stockinette of the 'Super Quick Hat' (page 4, top left) plump right up with Wool and the Gang Crazy Sexy Wool. It's warm, quick, and utterly charming—especially topped with a poofy Rowan Faux Fur Pompom! Tucking a hot water bottle at the foot of the bed all but promises pleasant dreams. Adorned with duplicate stitch (a new free chart), the 'Hot Water Bottle Cozy' (page 4, right) in Rowan Kid Classic is a heartfelt hug and a thoughtful gift. The 'Easy Three-Yarn Striped Triangle Scarf', (page 4, bottom) a new free pattern, is made magical in three magnificent yarns—one sparkly (Sesia Lola), one fuzzy (Blue Sky Fibers Brushed Suri), one fluffy (Rowan Brushed Fleece).

MORE-ISH: The airy Handmade Flavored Marshmallows from Butter Baked Goods of Vancouver, BC, are so delicious, you might pluck them from your cocoa before they're fully melted-well worth the sticky fingers. And the cubes provide more surface area for toasting (mathematically proven)! Cloud Cookies from Bunches & Bunches, Ltd. are a beautiful blend of sweet meringue and coconut macaroon. Light as air, they perfectly balance crisp and chewy.

FRIENDLY FACES: This year's Felted Mice Ornaments stole our hearts—we have such a soft spot for mice! These wee felted fellows will frolick through your home, scurry up your Christmas tree, and play peek-a-boo on packages. Each hand-crafted, wool felt mouse is an adorably unique individual. How many new friends can you spot scampering through these pages?

**EVERYTHING IN ITS PLACE**: Made by

hand just for us by the mother/daughter duo Tea that is Brass & Ink, these enameled Canister Tags are embellished with 40 our tea leaf. Tie Sweets them around the candy jar, biscuit tin. and tea caddy Biscuits so you can find vour treats in an instant!



# Peppermint Iwist


It's said that the scent of mint keeps mice away. It has quite the opposite effect on us Churchmice, though! Nothing refreshes us quite like peppy peppermint—we perk up as soon as the candy wrapper crinkles. The cool, sharp, sweetness sparks us to new heights of merry making. We even find ourselves reaching for yarn in peppermint-y colors!

MINT TO BE: Mint and chocolate form a practically perfect partnership—never more delicious than in the Marianne Chocolate-Filled Mint Candies. A delectable dark chocolate filling is encased in a peppermint shell. The Chocolate Rings with Sprinkles from Hermann the German blend smooth, dark chocolate with the sweet crunch of sprinkles—easy to munch through an entire packet! And of course, the 'Twas the Night Chocolate Mouse (tucked in its peaked red box) is nearly too cute to eat.

C'MON, GET JOLLY: Back in their festive apparel and packaged in a new gift tin, our Jolly Wee Elf Kits have gained a 'Jolly Great' friend with a free pattern adaptation! Just the right size for a hug, this big buddy, knit in Crazy Sexy Wool, is so fun to make—and easily scaled up with big yarns and big needles.

**BEDECKED:** The easy, cleverly textured 'Quick Mistake Rib Beanie' (page 6, center) is a new free pattern and a pleasure to knit in Rowan Big Wool. For fun, we've added not one, not two, but three pompoms to the top. Three times the merri-mint!

PEP IT UP: This season, stuff stockings with good old-fashioned minty treats. The swirling red-and-white stripes of *Swedish Peppermints* are classically delightful. Stir in a cup of cocoa (may we suggest *Chocolat Vitale?*) for a mint-chocolate treat—or enjoy on its own for pure peppermint pleasure. The *Wilhelmina Mints* white tablets offer a classic, biting taste that has remained unchanged for over 120 years! *Hammond's Organic* 



## All Sorts

Did you know? Licorice allsorts were invented when a hapless salesman dropped a tray of licorice samples, scrambling them all together. Seeing the colorful assortment of candies, the client promply ordered a batch. We're inspired to let a similar serendipity pick the colors for our next project!













We've gathered a batch of chunky-weight yarns for the 'Reversible Knitting Mitts' on page 9.

Left to right: Blue Sky Fibers Techno (mitts shown in cream), Brooklyn Tweed Quarry, Berroco Ultra Alpaca Chunky, Rowan Brushed Fleece, and Rowan Cocoon. We're thinking a pair in each!

### REVERSIBLE KNITTING MITTS

These cozy, chunky mitts (shown in Blue Sky Techno) knit up in a jiffy—perfect for last-minute giving! A reversible rib pattern gives two different looks. Knit to any length you like.

**Finished Sizes:** Child (Adult S/M, Adult M/L): Fits up to 7 (8, 9)"/18 (20, 23)cm palm; 9  $(10\frac{1}{2}, 10\frac{1}{2})$ "/23 (26.5, 26.5)cm long.

Details given for child size; larger sizes in parentheses (). When only one set of details given, it applies to all sizes.

**Yarn:** Approx. 75 (120, 140) yds/69 (110, 128)m of soft, chunky-weight yarn. Add or subtract approx. 5–6 yds/m yarn per knitted 1"/2.5cm per pair.

**Needles & Notions:** US 8 (5mm) set of 4 double-point needles, or size to obtain gauge. 1 locking marker. Darning needle to finish.

**Gauge:** Approx. 20 sts = 4" in K2/P1 ribbing, not stretched.

**Glossary:** K = knit; P = purl; St(s) = stitch(es).

Instructions given for child size; larger sizes in parentheses ( ). When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To make larger or smaller, add or subtract in multiples of 3 sts.

**Cast on:** Using cable cast-on method and working quite loosely, cast on 24 (30, 36) sts onto one needle. <u>Set-up row</u>: \*K2, P1\*; repeat between \* \* around, dividing sts onto two more needles. [12/6/6 (12/9/9, 12/12/12)].

**Ribbing:** Join in round, being careful not to twist. Clip locking marker into first st to designate beginning of round; move up as necessary. Round 1: \*K2, P1\*; repeat between \* \* around. Repeat Round 1 until work measures 7 (8, 8) 1/18 (20, 20)cm, or desired length to thumb hole.

**Thumb hole:** Round 1: K2, P1; keeping yarn in front, slip next st purlwise, bring yarn to back; \*slip 1 st purlwise, pass second st on right needle over first to bind off\*; repeat between \* \* until 5 (5, 8) sts are bound off. Slip last st remaining from bind-off back to left needle. Turn. Using cable cast-on method and working quite loosely, cast on 6 (6, 9) sts. Turn. With yarn in back, slip first st on left needle to right needle purlwise and pass last cast-on st on right needle over. Complete round in pattern as established. [24 (30, 36) sts]

Continue in K2/P1 ribbing for 1¾ (2¼, 2¼)"/4.5 (6, 6)cm, or desired length.

**Bind off:** Working a little loosely (a little tighter if your hands are very small), bind off in pattern. Cut yarn; fasten off. Weave in ends as invisibly as possible. Repeat for second glove.

**Finishing:** Soak for 20 min. in tepid water with a little no-rinse wool soap. Gently squeeze out as much water as possible. Roll in towel; gently squeeze out more moisture. Lay flat on blocking board (don't stretch out ribbing). Let dry thoroughly.



# Sugar & Spice

Caramel, toffee, and butterscotch are the golden, gooey, velvety neutrals of the candy world—they can go with anything! Encased in chocolate, twirled through cookie dough, drizzled over ice cream, sprinkled with salt and nuts—we've even heard tell of caramel candies melted in a cup of black tea. Egads, you can do almost as much with caramelized sugar as you can with wool!

**SNUG DOWN**: Stay toasty in the 'Super Quick Hat', a new free pattern (page 10, top). Super-chunky-weight Crazy Sexy Wool promises to keep out any chill! 'Woolly Loop Mittens' (page 10, bottom) beg to be taken outside to play. Knit in Berroco Ultra Alpaca Chunky, these mittens have frothy, spun-sugar cuffs in Loopy Mango Mohair So Soft.

**AGLOW:** The *Hornvarefabrikken Ornaments* are handmade in Bølingbjerg, Denmark. Each piece is one-of-a-kind because of natural variations in horn—its color can change in different lights, from

creamy ivory to amber!
You'll want to keep
the *Pomander Candle*(custom blended just for
us by *Wax & Wool*, *Etc.*)
alight all season long. The
warm, sweet scents of bergamot
and orange zest, clove and cedar,
fill the air as soon as you strike
a match.

**SWEET & SALTY:** The indulgent, creamy *Butter Toffee Caramels* 

from Everton Toffee hail from a centurieslong tradition—tasted and trusted by the likes of Charles Dickens and Queen Victoria! The mellow sweetness of Honey Hard Candies is a treat whether you drop them in tea or let them melt on your tongue. Salted caramel and milk chocolate are a delectable duo—blended in Chocolat Chaud's Salted Caramel cocoa, they're heavenly! (And the pretty, reusable tin makes a great gift.)

FRESH BAKED: Lars Swedish Ginger Snaps are baked to thin, crispy, melt-in-themouth perfection. The Van Den Berg

Dutch Cookies are sugar-encrusted celebrations in cinnamon and caramel. Helen Beard's illustrations of everyday life (encircling mugs and vases) charmed us at first sight. Delightful ice skaters (bundled in handknit hats and scarves), market goers, and cake makers are whimsically familiar. We can almost smell the bakery!



# Sweet Shimmer

In baking or knitting, the fun is in the frosting! Twinkling sugar crystals, pearly dragées, oodles of sprinkles—an iced cookie can look too good to eat, but tastes so delicious when you do. Bring sparkle to your needles with glittering yarns, beads, buttons, ribbons... the sweet possibilities are endless!

**FROSTY FLURRIES:** A decorative treat, lustrous *Chocolate Peppermint Snowflakes* from *Dolcetta Artisan Sweets* melt in your mouth like only snowflakes can.

A COOKIE & A CUPPA: To complement the sweetness of a sugar cookie (or the crumbly toothsomeness of *Heritage Shortbread*), we recommend a bright, refreshing tea like *Harney & Sons Winter White Earl Grey*—a white tea twist on the citrusy classic. Keep the pot warm with a 'Seed-Stitch Tea Cozy' (page 13, top right). A new free pattern knit in *Rowan* 

*Kid Classic*, we've frosted this cozy with a snowy pompom.

**ALL THE TRIMMINGS:** The Silver Crocheted Necklace Kit (page 13, lower right) is a great way to add sterling shine to your finery—and an easy, thoughtful gift! For your ribbon trimming needs, Studio Carta's Ribbon Scissors are up to the task.

GLISTEN: The crystalline Rose Geo Ornaments are frosty, pink, and glitter-dusted. The Glass Sheep Ornament is crafted with coated glass for a crackled, antiqued appearance. Baaah-rilliant!

### ROYAL ICING

Use this go-to recipe for piping, dipping, or spreading—adjust the thickness at your whim!

2 egg whites

2 cups powdered sugar

¼ tsp lemon juice

Combine ingredients in stand mixer; beat on low speed 'til combined. Beat 4–5 minutes on medium-high. When decorating, check consistency: if it's too thin for piping, stir in a little more powdered sugar; if it's too thick for dipping or spreading, stir in a few drops

of water (a little goes a long way). If adding sparkle sugar to cookies, sprinkle onto icing immediately. Allow to dry overnight. Refrigerate excess icing up to two days in airtight container with cling wrap directly on surface of icing; stir again before using. P.S. Storebought sugar cookies or ginger snaps are fair game!
