

EASY TRIANGLE SCARF ROWAN FINE TWEED HAZE VERSION

Soft flecks of fiber peek out of a fuzzy halo to add just enough interest to this simple one-row repeat. The generous size provides many options for styling and the light, yet insulating, fabric will keep you toasty warm throughout the season!

Finished Size:	Approx. 76"/193cm wingspan x 20"/51cm deep at center, <u>after</u> blocking.
Yarn:	2 skeins Rowan <i>Fine Tweed Haze</i> (235 yds/215m, 50g each). Or approx. 470 yds/430m of an equivalent DK-weight yarn.
Needles & Notions:	US 7 (4.5mm) 24–32"/60–80cm circular needle, or size to obtain gauge. US 8 (5mm) needle, or one size larger than gauge needle, for binding off. Blunt darning needle to finish. Blocking wires and T-pins, or fork blocking pins.
Gauge:	Approx. 16 sts = 4"/10cm in garter stitch, <u>after</u> blocking. <i>Note: Instead of swatching (yes, we said it), work until you are approx.</i> 5"/13cm deep to check that you like the fabric.
Glossary:	Inc('d) = increase(d); K = knit; KFB = knit into front then back of same st; St(s) = stitch(es); YO = yarn over (bring yarn forward between needles, then back over right needle).
Cast on:	With gauge needle, using long-tail cast-on method, cast on 3 sts.
Shaping:	Row 1: KFB, YO, knit to end. [2 sts inc'd]
	Repeat Row 1 until piece measures approx. 20"/51cm deep, or desired depth at center, <u>and</u> you have at least 20 yds/18m (approx. 4g) for binding off.
Bind off:	Change to <u>larger needle</u> and bind off knitwise, making sure that your bound-off edge doesn't pull in or flare out.
Finishing:	Weave in ends as invisibly as possible along edge of scarf.
	Soak for 20 minutes in tepid water with no-rinse wool soap. Gently squeeze out as much water as possible. Roll up in a towel and squeeze again; or place in zippered pillowcase or
