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Card 1: prep

Before class, it will be helpful if you have the following pieces stamped/die-cut etc. Jenn used Neenah Classic Crest Cover, Solar White 80#, Super Smooth for Copic coloring, card bases, and most white layers on cards unless otherwise noted. Lawn Fawn white cardstock item LF1753 is just that. Jenn also used Lawn Fawn Jet Black ink pad item LF1302 to stamp her images as she will be coloring with Copic markers.



Diecut the following:

- White Cardstock 4" x 5 1/4" (Jenn used Outside In Stitched Rectangle Stackables, LF1442 and Distress White Heavystock)
- "MISSUALOG" using Henry's ABCs LF2814 cut out of Woodgrain Cardstock - Dark Brown, LF2483

Card Base:

 cut to 4 1/4" x 11", folded to 4 1/4" x 5 1/2", vertical top fold

Stamp and diecut the following images:

(Jenn used Lawn Fawn Jet Black ink LF1302 that works with alcohol based markers and 80# Neenah cardstock which Lawn Fawn White Cardstock LF1753 is)

Wood You Be Mine?, LF3011 and Wood You Be Mine? Lawn Cuts, LF3012

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Card 2: prep

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Diecut the following:

- White Cardstock 4" x 5 1/4" (Jenn used Distress White Heavystock)
- Spiffy Speckles Pesto, LF1864 3" high, 4 1/4" wide (Jenn used Heart Garden Border, LF3019)
- Guava Cardstock, LF1117 (Jenn used Heart Garden Border, LF3019)

4 large hearts 6 small hearts

Card Base:

 cut to 4 1/4" x 11", folded to 4 1/4" x 5 1/2", vertical top fold

Stamp and diecut the following images:



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Copic Coloring Guide




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Copic Coloring Guide
