NOTE Helmets are highly recommended since MP routes are above SP. Hiking shoes and mosquito repellent are very useful.

Lopburi is one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in Thailand. It is today best known for its wild monkeys wandering everywhere around the city and specially in the vicinity of the Khmer temple near the train station. East of the city, approx. 20 km away from the monkeys, lies the limestone crag of Khao Jin Lae. Commonly called "Lopburi", the crag was developed on the peak of Khao Jin Lae at the foot of which is a Buddhist temple—Wat Pa Suwannahong. It is divided in two main sectors: the **Temple Area** and the **Secret Garden**. By its size and quality of the routes, Lopburi is one of the top climbing areas in central and northeast Thailand. Its main features are the 200 m multipitches which are the longest in Thailand and the best MPs around BKK, from the top of which you can enjoy the beautiful view over the area and the fields of sunflowers in late November. Some initiatives are currently taking place to rebolt and further bolt the crag whose first routes were bolted in the early 2000's. We must thank the local monks for giving their blessing to the development and access of the mountain to climbers. Please stop say hi to them and ask them for their authorisation to go climbing. They may ask you to fill your name in a record book or to take a picture of you. Please consider dropping a small donation directly to a monk or nun upon leaving the area.

Temple area is located right above/behind the temple. This is where the long 200 m MP are located.

Secret Garden, found by Jean-Jacques Braun, is located on the right hand side of the Temple area when facing the cliff.

CRAG HISTORY

The crag of Khao Jin Lae was discovered in the 1990's by Peter Andrich while on a business trip to Lopburi. Bolting however only started in 2000 by his friend David Estey after he moved to Thailand. The 4 multi-pitch routes to the summit, as well as the first to the top of Easter Island, were made by Benoit Grasser.

CRAG ACCESS

The crag is located approx. 150 km north of Bangkok. From BKK, take Phaholyothin road to Saraburi, and continue towards Lopburi on the same road. As you approach Lopburi, follow the access map on the right to Wat Pa Suwannahong where you can park and walk to the crag.






ACCESS

1) Directly to Secret Garden - from Wat Pa Suwannahong, keep going a little bit further on the same road you came from, past the temple. Park the car and follow the trail on your left heading to the right shoulder of the peak. Pass the desert shelter then go through the tapioca farm and follow the red marks - not so obvious. The trail arrives in front of the route Mamuang Yai. All routes are on the left of it. Access time: 10 mins from parking spot

2) From Temple area, hike to the rightest route **Manao**. Keep going through the dense vegetation (no path) for around 5 to 10 mins. Take the corridor going down and you will reach Vanda Blossom.

Access time: 30 mins from wat Pa Suwannahong






