

# How To Measure Your Finger

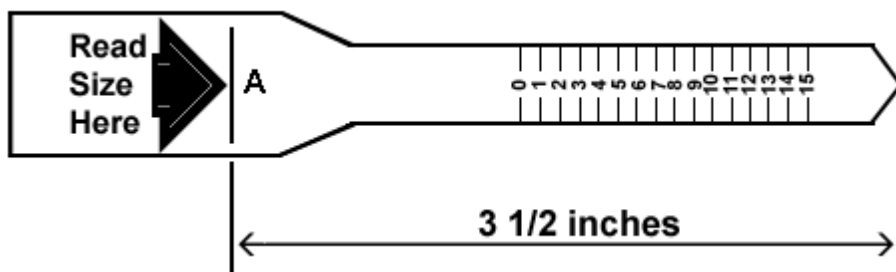
## Using String or Paper:

1. Wrap string or paper around the base of your finger.
2. Mark the point where the ends meet with a pen.
3. Measure the string or paper with a ruler (mm).
4. Pick the closest measurement on the ring size chart to find your ring size.

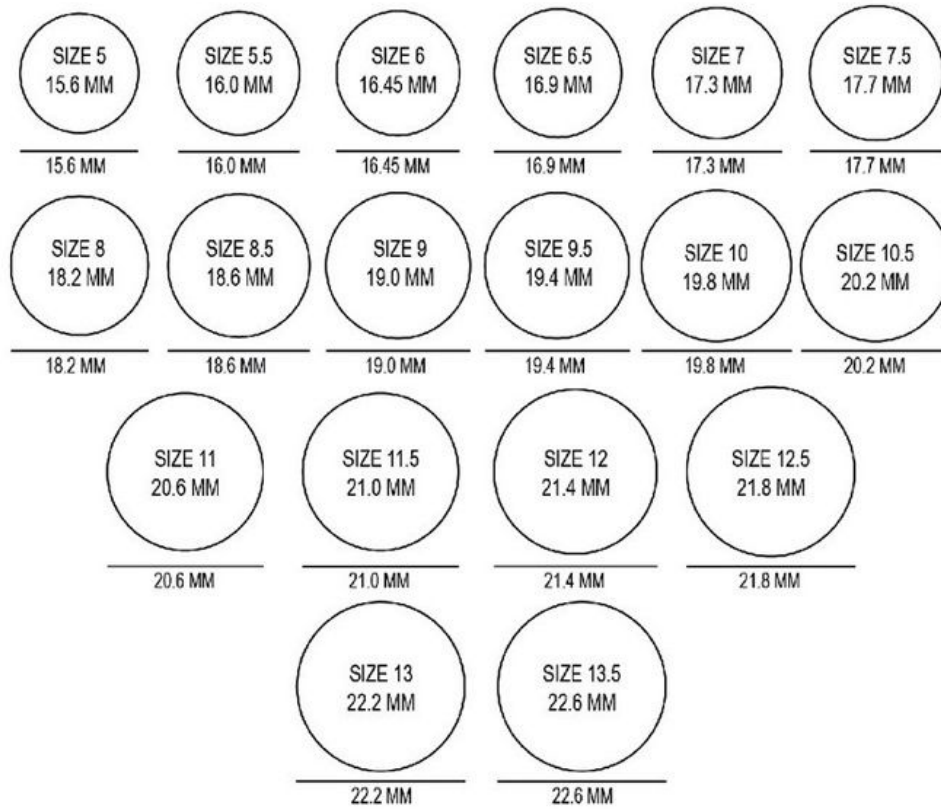
## Using Paper Sizer:

1. Print the Printable Ring Size Chart (at 100%) and carefully cut out the strip.
2. Measure the 3-1/2 inch guide to verify the correct length.
3. Cut a slit in the Line Marker "A".
4. Slide the pointed end through the slit around your finger.
5. Read the size where the slit lines up on the chart.



## Measure an Existing Ring:

1. Use the printable chart below to measure the inside diameter of a ring you have that already fits the finger you want to wear the new ring on.
2. Lay your ring flat on the chart and find the size that most closely matches the diameter of your ring.



## More Ring Sizing Tips:

1. Measure the inside of another ring that fits using a ruler.
2. The ring should fit your finger comfortably: snug enough so it won't fall off, but loose enough to slide over your knuckle with relative ease.
3. When the knuckle is bigger than the base of the finger, measure both places and pick a size in between the two.
4. Measure your ring size at the end of the day when your fingers are warm. Finger size changes depending on the time of day and the weather, and your fingers are actually smaller in the early morning and in cold weather. Also, keep in mind that fingers on your dominant hand are usually larger.
5. Measure 3 to 4 times for more accuracy.
