





Is Your Doggie's Doo-Doo Healthy? Check the Poppy's Picnic **POO-OMETER**

 <p>Runny and stinky</p>	 <p>Hard and crumbly</p>	 <p>Big and smelly</p>	 <p>Small and odourless</p>
<p>REASON: Diarrhoea is a sign your dog's body is eliminating a toxin perhaps from eating something in the park or scavenging in the rubbish. Over exercising, being stressed and a long car journey can also cause an upset tummy, while switching diet could have a temporary effect</p>	<p>REASON: Your dog sounds constipated. The moisture has been absorbed as the waste has stayed in your dog's colon for too long, making the stool dry, hard and difficult to pass</p>	<p>REASON: Kibble often contains grains such as barley, corn and rice that your dog cannot digest. Over 70% of the ingredients are excreted and you have the displeasure of disposing of it</p>	<p>REASON: Your dog is likely raw fed. With no bulkers and fillers in the food, very little consumed is turned into poo making them firmer, smaller, odourless, and pickup-able</p>
<p>SOLUTION: If symptoms persist for more than 48hrs call your Vet, especially if your dog is sick, bloated or lethargic</p>	<p>SOLUTION: Introduce some fresh veggies such as butternut squash or pumpkin and make sure there is plenty of fresh water to drink</p>	<p>SOLUTION: Consider introducing a complete, biologically appropriate raw food diet with a high meat content</p>	<p>SOLUTION: Sit back and relax. It is clear your dog has a healthy diet and digestive system</p>
