Engage-its Prep

To prepare these Engage-Its Trifolds, you first must print them front-to-back on your home computer. I suggest making a master copy first and then running it through your copy machine at school to make double-sided copies. If your home printer can print double-sided, click the option for "Short-Edge Printing" so that it prints in the correct orientation. Don't forget to choose the landscape mode and choose "actual size" if you are printing on a Mac.

Please NOTE: There are TWO cover options for August/September and an additional option for September. There are also TWO options for December.

Implementation

You can use these Engage-Its to ensure that your students are reading at home each month AND become excited to actually read as well! You can also offer an incentive to the class/students for completing all of the reading activities.

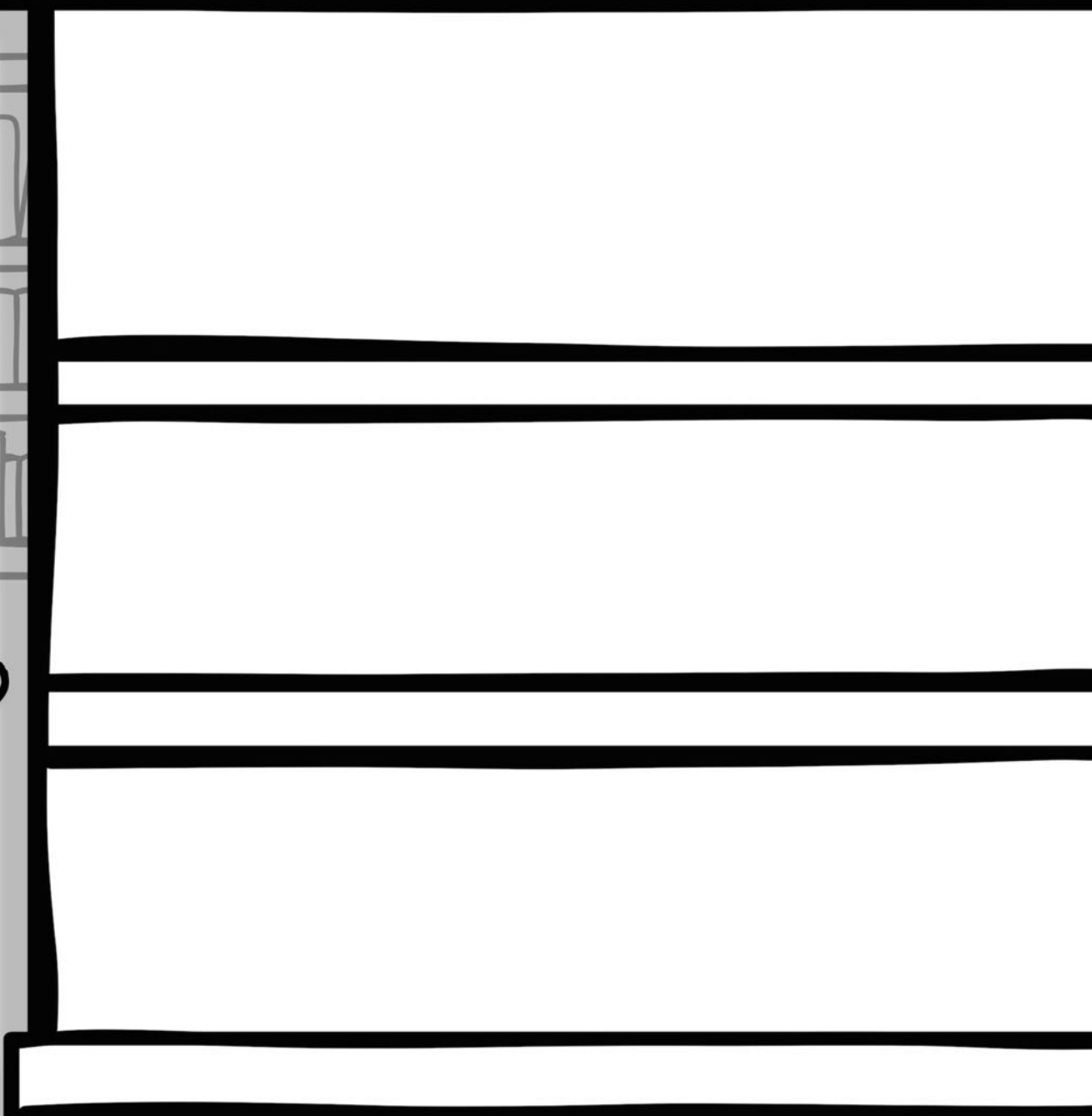
