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APPLICATION

WOUND CARE:

Thoroughly spray Prontosan[®] Wound Spray onto the entire wound and the wound site. With this, the risk for infection is reduced and optimal healing conditions are generated. Afterwards, cover the wound with a dressing. Clotted or encrusted dressings can be moistened with Prontosan[®] Wound Spray in order to be easily removed and to avoid pain during removal.⁶

USE WITH TRANSURETHRAL CATHETERS:

Thoroughly moisten a sterile gauze and cleanse the catheter entry site.

PEG- / PEJ-TUBES AND SUPRAPUBICAL CATHETERS:

For cleansing of entry port, apply a sufficient amount of Prontosan[®] Wound Spray. For encrustations, leave on for at least 1 minute. Dry surrounding skin area by dabbing with a sterile gauze and apply a sterile cover afterwards.
