CERT "EVERBRIDGE" CALL-OUT SYSTEM AGAIN

OPERATIONAL! We are pleased to report that the CERT call-out system is again operational. The 100 members who volunteered to undergo the police "Live Scan" background check process have all had their alert information entered into the system. When CERT members are needed for a non-disaster event, such as a search for a missing child, an alert will be sent via cell phone, text, email and home phone stating the nature of the emergency and providing the location of the Staging area. We will be testing the system in the next 30 days. **Please closely monitor you emails for notifications on the test alert.**


Monterey CERT Classes Are Taught By Your Local FEMA/CERT Instructors, Who Are Fully Qualified to Instruct Any Group Or Module of CERT, Regardless Of

Age Or Other Demographic. Classes are taught using the 9 module FEMA curriculum and incorporate areas of CERT unique to Monterey such as our 12 neighborhood containers and our very advanced radio system. Students also receive basic training in the Incident Command System (ICS). ICS is the command system used at all major National incidents such as storms, major fires and also at local emergencies. ICS-100 is a part of the FEMA/CERT curriculum.

Contact Your CERT Zone Captain To See Your

Neighborhood Container. Consult the list below to contact your CERT Zone Captain about seeing your neighborhood container. Located at eleven locations, plus Monterey High School, the containers serve as equipment caches and Staging Areas for local members to assemble, get equipment and go into the neighborhoods.

Yes, It Happens Here! On December 15, 1980, Christopher Porter, 15 months old, was brought to the surface by first responders after being rescued from a well 22 feet deep in his Del Rey Oaks backyard. This rescue took many hours to reach a successful conclusion. The young boy suffered only minor injuries. Monterey firefighters and Granite Construction Company equipment operators worked together to reach Christopher with a complex trenching and tunneling operation. Christopher was examined by his doctor on site and found to be in good condition, despite his incredible ordeal. This is the type of non-disaster related incident CERT can be deployed in to provide support and perimeter control.
