RING SIZE GUIDE

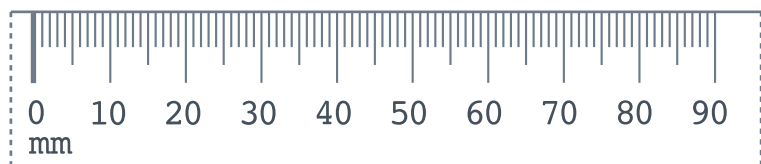
Method 1 using our printable millimeter ruler

- 1) Print this guide with page scaling set to 100%. If you're unsure, check accuracy with a ruler. 1cm = 10mm.
- 2) Cut out the measuring paper below and tightly wrap it around your finger. If you have a thin piece of string or ribbon, that works too!
- 3) Mark the paper or string at the tightest point, then unroll it and measure with the millimeter ruler below.
- 4) Consult the circumference guide on this page to find your ring size.

Ring Size Circumference Guide

Finger Circumference	Ring Size
47mm	4
50mm	5
52mm	6
54mm	7
57mm	8
60mm	9
62mm	10

Tips & Tricks

- 1) It's best to measure your ring size in the afternoon or evening when your fingers are likely to be at their largest.
- 2) Make sure your hands are warm when measuring. Cold weather can shrink fingers up to half a size.
- 3) Wrap the paper as tight as you can around your finger. There shouldn't be gaps between your finger & the paper.
- 4) If your finger falls between two sizes, we recommend that you round up to the nearest whole size for a comfortable fit.

Method 2 using a ring you already own

- 1) Print this guide with page scaling set to 100%.
- 2) Using a ring that you already own (or have borrowed, if this is a gift!) and place it over the circles below.
- 3) Match the inside of the ring to the circle that is closest in size. The measurements below refer to the inside diameter of your ring.
- 4) If the ring falls between two sizes, order the larger size.
