





EXTINCT ANIMALS IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Here are some animals that have gone extinct from each continent in just the past 20 years.

AFRICA

Western Black Rhino

- Due to human poaching for their horns
- Lived 7-8 million years

OCEANIA

The Bramble Cay Melonys (QLD, Australia)

• Due to climate change

EUROPE

The Pyrenean Ibex (Spain)

ASIA

Yangtze River Dolphin (Baiji Dolphin) (China)

- Due to over fishing & pollution of their habitat in the last 50 years
- Lived for over 20,000,000 years

NORTH AMERICA

Eastern Cougar (USA/CANADA)

European immigrants killed cougars to protect themselves and their livestock plus the destruction of their habitat in later years

SOUTH AMERICA

Alaotra Grebe (Madagascar)

 Due to habitat destruction, water pollution and introduction of carnivorous fish that depleted the Grebe's food supply.



ANIMALS NEAR EXTINCTION NOW!

Northern White Rhino (Africa)

Only two northern white Rhinoceros remain in the world. Both are female and live under constant protection from poaches in Kenya's OI Pejeta Conservatory.

Javan Rhinoceros (Indonesia)

There are three species of Javan Rhinos – two species are already extinct! The last group live in the western end of Java and only around 60 adults remain. Excessive poaching for their horns and their food source being taken over by Palm Plantations (Palm Oil) Plantations is the reason they are vulnerable.

Vaquitas (USA) World's Rarest Marine Mammal

This tiny Porpose only lives in the Gulf of California. Due to local fishing they are often caught and drown in nets or they are killed by boats.

It is estimated that only around 10-20 remain alive.

Ivory Billed Woodpecker (South Eastern USA & Cuba)

Thought to be extinct for the previous go years, in 2004 World Wildlife Fund reported that the Ivory Billed Woodpecker had been found in Arkansas. Due to complete loss of habitat being the cause of their demise, WWF are now buying land parcels wherever sightings are reported to try and help keep the species alive.

New Zealand Fairy Tern (North Island)

This dainty little tern is the most endangered of New Zealand's endemic birds. Due to predators and human disturbance only 40 or so birds are left and less than 12 breeding pairs.

Amur Leopard (Northern Russia, Korea, China)

The Amur Leopard is threatened by poaching for its beautiful skin, habitat loss and deforestation. It is estimated that only 30 individuals are left living in the wild. Zoos around the world have a combined collection of approximately 300 Amur Leopards and are crucial in maintaining the species.



ENDANGERED ANIMALS


Just a quick point on one of our favourite species which need our help – Bornean and Sumatran Orangutans (Asia). Approximately 2,000-3,000 Bornean Orangutans were killed every year in the past 40 years alone. Mostly by human activity such as logging, illegal animal trade, deforestation for Palm Oil Plantations etc. This is a loss of more than 50% of their population! At this rate of killing, Orangutans could be extinct within the next 50 years.

How you can help -

- Shop Palm Oil Free
- Go to the OFI (Orangutan Foundation International) website and get their Palm Oil Awareness Toolkit and spread the word to family, friends and school friends (Makes a great project).
- Raise money and donate to OFI for Rambutans Fruit for the Orangutans or you can even foster an Orangutan for a year! (Talk to your teacher, this could be an excellent class project).
- Go to Wildlife websites and learn about as many endangered species as you can and keep telling people how important they are (try www.earthkids.com for some great information).
- Visit a Wildlife Refuge and if one is near your home offer to volunteer.


- Be mindful of your local environment. Never Litter and if you walk past some trash, pick it up and put it in the bin. Contact your local council and see when the next beach or creek clean-up is scheduled and volunteer.
- Turn your backyard or school yard into a wildlife habitat.
- Tell family to buy eggs, dairy and meant from farms that practice 'free-range' techniques.
- Plant and grow a vegetable garden without using pesticides and artificial fertilizers. Don't forget to include some flowers for the Honey Bees too ::





