## REDUCING DISTRACTIONS

Try to have distraction free interaction time with your child every day



# BE A SPORTS BROADCASTER

Model language surrounding what your child is doing. Make short and simple statements which are at a slightly higher level of understanding.



# CORRECT PHRASES IN POSITIVE TONE

You don't have to say "no" before repeating or ask them "did you mean?" Just repeat it back correctly in an encouraging way.



#### **MATCH** +1 & +2


Expand what your child says by adding one or two words to what they say.



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


# PLAY PEOPLE GAMES (EX. PEEK A BOO)

People games involve the child's attention being directed towards another person to encourage the development of social communication abilities.

## PERSPECTIVE TAKING

When talking with your child, share your opinion and your feelings. During play or daily routines, set up "problems" and allow your child the opportunity to generate solutions.



## FOLLOW YOUR CHILD'S LEAD

Similarly, try to refrain from saying "say" and asking questions as this can discourage communicative attempts.
