Sing Everywhere Around Me together.



Ask a family member to read Psalm 19 v 1-4.

This psalm tells us that the 'skies proclaim the work of his hands'. **Go on a fact hunt together!** What amazing facts can you find out about the sky or space? Make it a game! Who can find the best fact? Winner gets a round of applause!



Spend a moment thinking about your new-found facts and other amazing things in creation – what do they tell us about God? Remember that the God who made all these wonderful things is the same God who loves you and knows every detail about you. How does this make you feel?

You could fit a million earths inside the sun, and the sun is considered an average-sized star!

#### TALK IT OVER

Read Genesis 1 v 27 and Romans 1 v 20. Use these questions to help **explore** the passages:

- 1. How do you think creation reveals God's 'eternal power' and 'divine nature'? Do we reveal this about God too, and how?
- 2. Can you think of any times in the Bible when Jesus uses nature to tell us something about God?
- 3. What sets humans apart from the rest of creation? God made us in His own image, what do you think this means?

### REMEMBER THIS

#### Psalm 19 v 1-4

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.

## **KEEP GOING**

Make a Nature Treasure Chest! Decorate an egg box or small cardboard box and label it as your Nature Treasure Chest. On your walks and trips out, collect things like leaves, stones, fallen blossom etc., then bring them home to go in your chest. The mission of collecting these treasures, and giving them a special place to be stored in, will help to remind you how incredible God's creation is and how it shows us His great power.
