




The return of *hospitality*



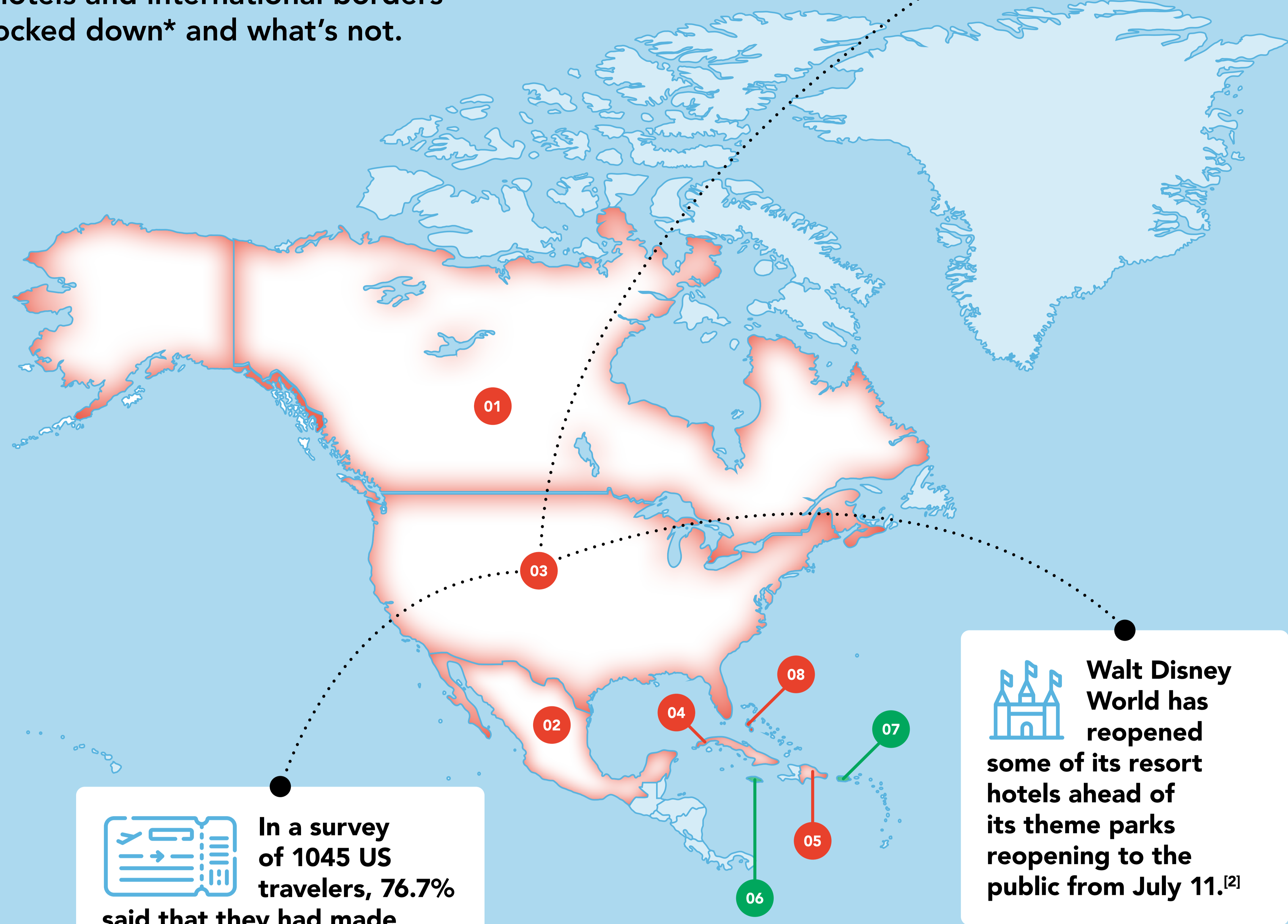

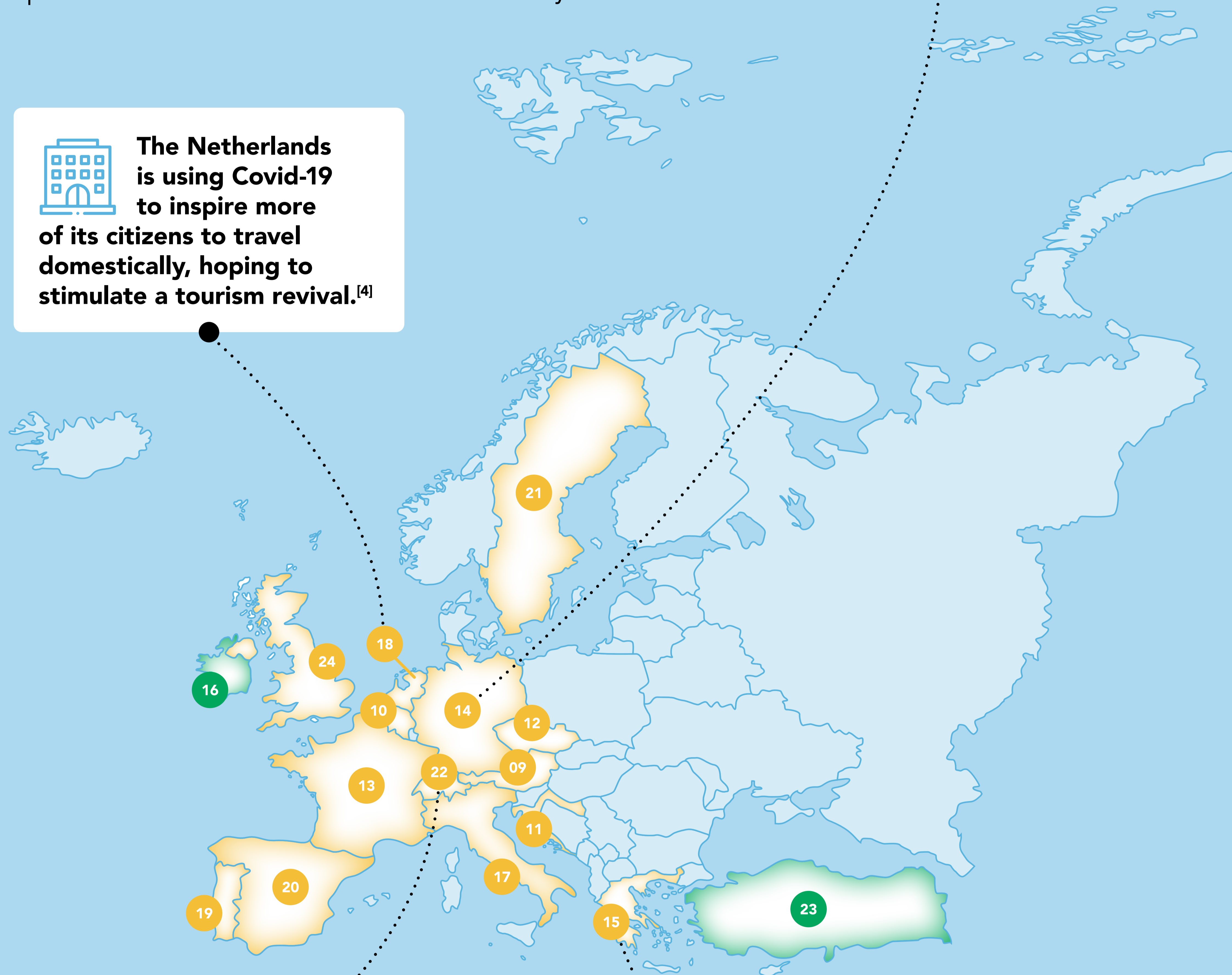
