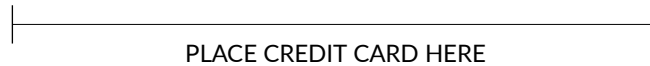

Ring Size Guide

Before measuring your ring size, be sure this guide is printed in US Letter size (216 x 279 mm) and scaled to 100%.
If you don't have access to a printer, please refer to Option 3.

TIP: To check the accuracy of your print, position a credit card on the line below or place the correct coin in one of the labeled ring sizes. If either the card or the coin lines up, you can begin measuring your size!



Option 1:

Measure by matching your ring

To find your ring size, use an existing ring that fits you well. Match the inside of that ring with one of the circles below. When your ring has been placed on the right size, you should see only the white circle – with no colored space inside your ring. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size.



Option 2 (recommended):

Measure with our ruler



1. Cut out the ruler above.
2. Carefully cut the line to create a slit.
3. Wrap the ruler around your finger at the base and pull the tapered end through the slit.

We recommend selecting a size that goes on and off your finger easily.

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Option 3:

DIY: Make your own ruler

1. Cut out a strip of paper that is no wider than 1.4 cm
2. Wrap it around the base of your ring finger.
3. Use a pen to mark the point on the string/paper where it overlaps, forming a complete circle.

Next, with a ruler, please measure the length from the starting end of the string/paper to the pen mark.

Use the table below to find out your ring size based on the circumference.

* If in-between sizes, please choose the ring size that is closest to your circumference.
