Greetings from Sewa team!

After spending the first quarter of the year laying out the ground work and identifying deprived communities, our team is all charged up for the next three quarters to reach out to the people who need us.

2017 activities are going to be different from past years, keeping the core principle of serving humanity regardless of race, religion, caste, color or gender. In fact, this year's focus will be on overall development of the community in several aspects such as Sanitation, Education through Sponsor a Child program, Health care and Community development.

Following are the projects taken up for the next Quarter:

I. Sanitation

1. Bijapura, Karnataka – 20 toilets, 5 bathrooms and wash basin area (see picture 1.1)

We are supporting Vivekananda School, which is providing free education for the destitute and orphaned children. These children are from the tribal and backward classes of Managuli region of Bijapur. Majority of them are girls.

Activities in and around Bijapur

- a. Vocational training courses for young adults who have dropped out of schools
- b. Virtual online classroom program through Larsen and Toubro (L and T)
- c. Women empowerment program through L and T
- d. Organic farming through Sewa International
- e. ODF (open defecation free) communities through Sewa International and Texas Instruments (TI)

2. Bidar, Karnataka – we have already provided toilets in Basavatheertha Vidyapeeta School where more than 60% of the students are girls.

This year we will focus on

- **a.** Lambani tandas , local tribal group (see picture 1.2)
- **b.** Tribal area
- c. Organic farming
- **d.** ODF (open defecation free) communities

- 3. Chunar, Mirzapur District of Uttarpradesh Repair 5 existing toilets and build 10 toilets/5 bathrooms in SVM school where majority of the students are girls, provide one sanitary napkin machine (see picture 1.3)
 - a. Virtual online classroom training
 - b. Vocational training courses for young adults who have dropped out of schools
