I. Bio-toilet installation - Rajasthan

Area of work: Sikhar

In Jan 2020, Sewa team conducted a need analysis for building 50 toilets in the Sikar District of Rajasthan supported by SODHANI FOUNDATION. Due to Covid-19, toilet installation was postponed to July. In phase 1, our work is almost complete. (See Table 1)

We have initiated the bio-toilet installation of Phase 2 schools in the last week of August, the toilet construction work will be completed by the second/third week of September. We are building 52 toilet/urinal units benefitting 2652+ students. (See Figure 1)

Our team distributed face shields, gloves, and other equipment to Basavanagudi Traffic police station and Basavanagudi Law & order Police station. This distribution drive benefited 70+ police staff. (See figure 4)
