I. Bio-toilet installation

Area of work: Dindigul, Tamil Nadu Beneficiaries: 500+ school children

In our previous monthly report, we had shared the need analysis conducted in Dindigul, Tamilnadu. We have built 15 toilet units in these identified schools in Dindigul. (see figure 1)

Area of work: Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh

Sewa team conducted need analysis in 10 government schools, Gorakhpur. Under Repair and Renovation Phase I, we are planning to repair and renovate 50 toilet units in Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh. (See table 1)
