**Curvy Fashionista and MTM are pretty much the same except for two points: biceps and thighs.** For patterns that are fitted to those points, sleeves, pants, and anything else form-fitting will need to be let out slightly to fit MTM.

**Curvy Collector might be called ‘curvy’ but she is more like a whole different body shape!** Her proportions are hourglass vs pear. She is only .5cm narrower in the hips, but up to a full cm fuller in the bust, waist, thighs, and arms. How these measurements are distributed is also different: fashionista and MTM are flatter/wider while collector is deeper/narrower. Some patterns may work, but most will need to be adjusted all over.
