A boy is recycling newspapers. A girl is recycling cans.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> Why are the animals happy?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> The animals are happy because the children are taking care of the earth.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> How are the kids on page 2 helping the earth?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> Possible answers: The girl is letting the sun and wind dry the clothes. She is saving electricity. The boy is riding his bike instead of riding in a car or bus.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> Let's look at pages 4-5. How are things being reused?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answers: A gift is wrapped in comics from the newspaper instead of wrapping paper. A yogurt container is used as a flowerpot. A reusable bag is used for groceries. A plastic bottle is reused as a bird feeder. A milk carton is used as a bird's home.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> What are the kids doing on page 8?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> The kids are making art projects from reused materials. A girl is making a castle from a used paper bag. A boy is making animals from recycled milk cartons. They are going to have an art show.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> If you could do one thing from the book to help the earth, what would you do?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answers: I would take cans to the recycling center. I would walk to school. I would plant seeds in yogurt containers.</p>
