The big fish is a shark.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> Why is the small fish hiding?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> The small fish is hiding so the shark won't eat him.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> What other animals do you see hiding?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> A caterpillar is hiding from a bird. A spider is hiding from a frog. A squirrel is hiding from a fox. A mouse is hiding from an owl.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What habitats do you see?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> I see an ocean habitat and a forest habitat. I also see a pond habitat.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> Why does the mouse have to keep hiding?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> The mouse needs to keep hiding from the owl and the raccoon.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> Can you think of another animal that hides?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answers: A lizard hides from a snake. A fox hides from a dog. A rabbit hides from a wolf.</p>
