<p>Q1: What story does the cover picture tell?</p> <p>A1: A green, funny frog is sitting under a hot sun. He is sipping lemonade. He made a big gallon of lemonade. There are smaller bottles on the table too.</p> <p>Q2: What do you think the frog is going to do?</p> <p>A2: Possible answers: I think the frog will divide up the lemonade into the smaller bottles. I think the frog is going to have a lemonade stand. He will sell different size bottles of lemonade.</p>	<p>Q1: What happens to the gallon of lemonade?</p> <p>A1: Just when Frog is getting ready to drink the gallon of lemonade, his friends start coming. So Frog starts dividing up the lemonade so everyone gets an equal amount.</p> <p>Q2: When all sixteen friends show up, how much lemonade does each friend get?</p> <p>A2: Each friend will get one cup of lemonade. So there are sixteen cups in one gallon!</p>	<p>Q1: How did Frog end up with a gallon of lemonade?</p> <p>A1: Frog said everyone should go swimming first. So Frog put all sixteen cups of lemonade back in the gallon jar and put it in the refrigerator to keep it cold.</p> <p>Q2: How many half gallons, quarts, pints, and cups are in a gallon?</p> <p>A2: There are two half gallons, four quarts, eight pints, and sixteen cups in a gallon.</p>
