Partnering with African traditions, we create over 150 jobs for women who in turn negotiate their own salaries and earn fair wages, which enables them to buy land, health insurance or send their children to school for the first time. As we respect traditional African craft, we help Artisans adapt their enterprise to successful and sustainable business.

Meet Yolanda Sebastiana Calgua Morales, 34 years old

She lives in the village of Quiejel near Chichicastenango. An avid weaver since the age of eight, Yolanda recalls when she was a small child, she would sit for hours watching her mother weave, fascinated by the designs she was able to create. At the age of seven, her mother and grandmother taught her the traditional art of backstrap weaving and to this day, many consider Yolanda a master weaver. Yolanda specializes in complex brocade textile designs, yet also produces simpler backstrap woven textiles. She creates intricate designs incorporating significant symbols from her culture. She is thankful to have learned this art from two of her role models, and hopes to teach her daughter in order to preserve their culture. Outside of weaving, Yolanda is also knowledgeable in other artistic techniques, including creating hand woven rugs, weaving pine needle baskets, and crocheting. Through her art, Yolanda has been invited to participate in fairs in the US twice.

ungalli **HOW WE TRANSFORM PLASTIC BOTTLES INTO RECYCLED CLOTHING**

- 1 Plastic PET bottles are recycled by consumers and transported to community recycling centres to be sorted and baled.
- 2 Items are thoroughly cleaned, labels and caps are removed and the bottles are sorted by colour.
- 3 PET bottles are shaved into flakes, then melted into small pellets.
- 4 Pellets are reduced again and put through showerhead-like nozzles that turn them into yarn fiber.
- 5 The resulting yarn is used to create fabric for a variety of textiles, including our recycled polyester!

STATS
 *One Ungalli recycled t-shirt saves approximately 10 plastic bottles from landfill.
 †It takes 2720 litres of water to make a traditional t-shirt (the amount most of us drink over the course of three weeks). Every Ungalli tee saves a whopping 265 litres of water by only using 25 litres in production.
 ‡By using a small production radius, each shirt saves approximately 2 litres of petroleum and reduces carbon dioxide output by 13 kilograms.

In East Asia we restore hope to women escaping human trafficking and exploitation by providing life-changing opportunities through Holistic Care Programs and social enterprise. Women learn to create beautiful jewellery and become managers, accountants, graphic designers, and photographers. Through Holistic Care Programs services like vocational training, healthcare, shelter, counseling, and education grants are provided for the women and children. The exact location of our work is undisclosed due to the nature of care.

Meet Fay, 24 years old

Fay grew up in a poor village in the countryside with her parents and her older brother. When she was in high school she had to drop out before earning her diploma. Then, she was trafficked into a brothel by a relative. She was only a teenager at the time. While she was working in the brothel, she was incredibly depressed, alone and without any hope. She was not sure if she would survive working there much longer. One day, outreach teams met her in the brothels and offered her a way out through their organization. She started working in jewellery production and is now able to study for her Bachelors degree. Her dream is to become an accountant.



Meet June, 27 years old

June comes from a minority group and from an abusive home making her high risk for being trafficked. She came to work making jewellery in 2013, and has excelled in her various roles. Today, June is studying photography and is responsible for taking the product photos.



INDIA (2 Partner Organizations)

In India we work through Fair Trade Practices. All Artisans receive fair wages, education and financial and technical assistance, while working in safe conditions. In addition, a Girls Education Fund has been established to help combat the reality that 64% of adolescent girls are forced to leave school early to care for younger siblings, help run the household, or for arranged marriages.

Meet Sonia

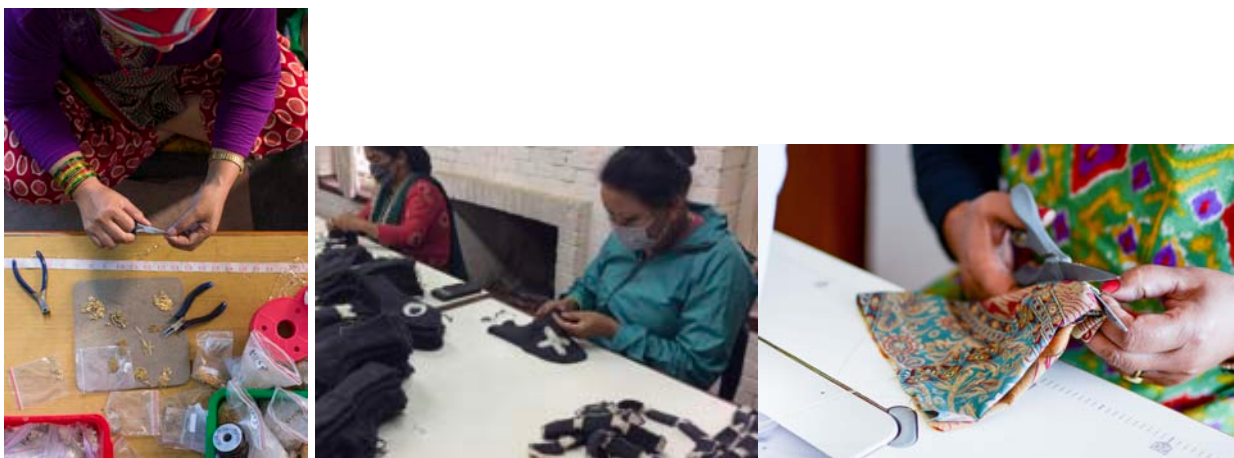

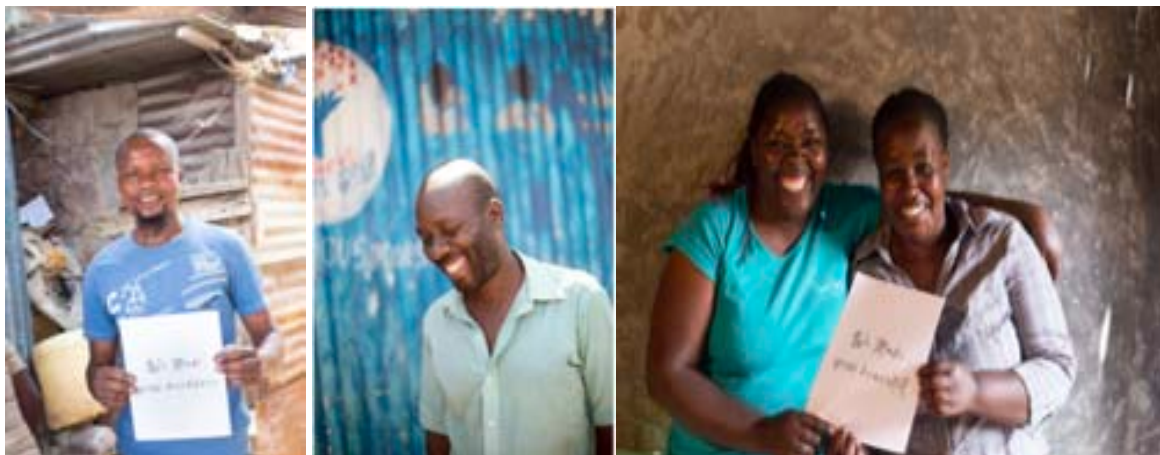




KENYA (2 Partner Organizations)
