

INSTRUCTION MANUAL

CLOSED EYE BOLT FOR HAMMOCKS AND HANGING CHAIRS



CHOOSE INSTALLATION LOCATION

Select a suitable location for your eye bolt in the wood. Ensure it's anchored in a strong and structurally sound part of the wood surface. Consider the weight or load you plan to hang from the eye bolt.

MARK THE INSTALLATION POINT:

Use a tape measure to mark the exact spot where you want to install the eye bolt. Mark it with a pencil or marker. Ensure it's level and in the right position.

DRILL A PILOT HOLE:

Use a drill with a wood bit that is slightly smaller in diameter than the shank of the eye bolt (around 6mm is a common choice). Drill a pilot hole at the marked spot to a depth of about half the length of the eye bolt.

SCREW IN THE EYE BOLT:

Insert the threaded end of the eye bolt into the pilot hole and turn it clockwise with a screwdriver or drill until the eye and plate are facing in the direction you want to hang your item. Be careful not to overtighten, as this could damage the wood.







ATTACH YOUR ITEM:

Now, you can attach your hammock, planter, or other object to the eye bolt's eye or plate using the appropriate hardware or connections, such as carabiner clips or chains.

TIGHTEN SECURELY:

Ensure the eye bolt is securely attached. Give it a gentle tug to check its stability.



FOR MASONRY INSTALLATION:



Select a suitable location for your eye bolt on the masonry surface. Ensure it's anchored in a strong and structurally sound part of the masonry. Consider the weight or load you plan to hang from the eye bolt.

MARK THE INSTALLATION POINT:

Use a tape measure to mark the exact spot where you want to install the eye bolt. Mark it with a pencil or marker. Ensure it's level and in the right position.

DRILL A PILOT HOLE:

Use a drill with a masonry bit that matches the size of the rawl plug you will use. Drill a hole to the depth of the rawl plug.

INSERT THE RAWL PLUG:

Insert the rawl plug into the hole.

ATTACH THE EYE BOLT:

Attach the eye bolt by turning it clockwise into the rawl plug using a screwdriver or drill until the eye and plate are facing in the direction you want to hang your item.

TIGHTEN SECURELY:

Ensure the eye bolt is securely attached but avoid overtightening, as this could weaken the masonry anchor.

ATTACH YOUR ITEM:

Now, you can attach your hammock, planter, or other object to the eye bolt's eye or plate using the appropriate hardware or connections.

TEST FOR STABILITY:

Give a gentle tug or test the load-bearing capacity of the installation to ensure it's secure.
