SKILLS USED:

Lacing

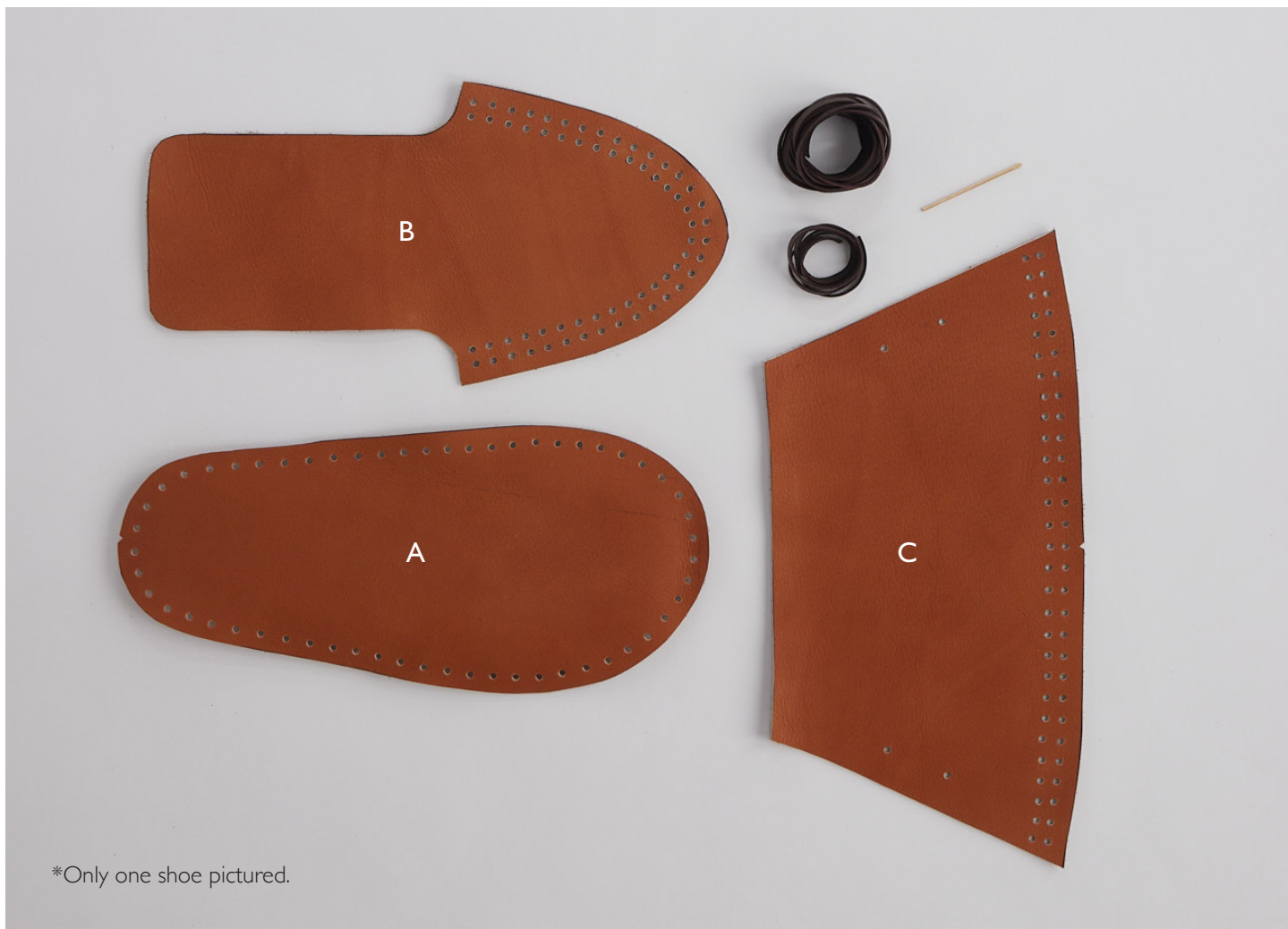
RECOMMENDED TOOLS:

Binder Clips to secure leather pieces.
Stitching Horse to hold leather pieces while stitching.
Scratch Awl to widen stitch holes.

GLOSSARY:

FLESH SIDE: The underside of an animal's hide. On veg-tanned tooling leather, this is the rough side.

GRAIN SIDE: The hide's surface that had the hair of the animal. Typically used for carving and stamping.

FOR SHEARLING MOCCASIN KITS

1. To aid in stitching, trim the shearling with a pair of scissors near the stitch holes.

PREPARING LACING NEEDLE

2. Make a long & sharp diagonal cut at one end of the leather lace. (Figure 1)
3. Insert the sharp end of the lace into the end of the needle. (Figures 2-3)
4. Hold lace flat between two fingers and twist the needle clockwise as much as possible. Tug on the lace to ensure it is secured.
5. Tie a loose knot at the other end of the lace. (Figure 4)

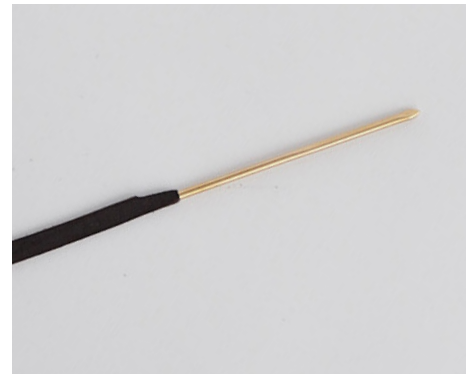

LACING MOCCASIN TOGETHER

NOTE: The top row of stitches is referred to as "Line 1". The bottom row (closest to the edge) is referred to as "Line 2". Reference the included paper pattern as needed to confirm information before lacing.

6. Align the center notch of Sole (A), heel edge, with the center notch of Heel (C). Sole (A) overlaps Heel (C) grain sides facing up. (Figure 5)

7. Insert the prepared needle into the center hole of "Line 1" from the flesh side of Heel (C). Then through the center-right hole of Sole (A). (Figure 6)

8. With the toe of the Sole (A) facing you, Insert the needle into the hole to the right of center on "Line 2" Heel (C). (Figure 7)

9. With the needle now on the flesh side, loop it into the hole above it on "Line 1" and back to the grain side. (Figures 8-9)

10. Repeat steps 7- 9 loop stitching to the right until you reach the third set of holes from the end of the Heel (C). (Figure 10)

ATTACHING THE TOE

11. Overlap Heel (C) over Toe (B) by two holes. Pull the lace through all three layers and continue to lace around the Toe (B). (Figures 11-14)

12. Overlap the Heel (C) over the other side of Toe (B) the same way the left is. (Figure 15)

13. Lace until you reach the last set of holes. Pull needle to the inside and tie a knot with the other end. (Figures 16-19)

FINISHING THE MOCCASIN

14. Massage the edges of the moccasin to help form the shoe.

15. Use the needle to guide the material evenly between the laces. (Figure 20)

16. Prepare needle again and thread lace through eyelets. Lace Moccasins and tie a bow. (Figures 21-23)

17. Fold the tongue and heel down to reveal the flesh side of the material. (Figure 24) **Pro Tip: Use scissors to trim into a low top or cut fringe.**

18. Repeat steps 2-17 on the other Moccasin.
