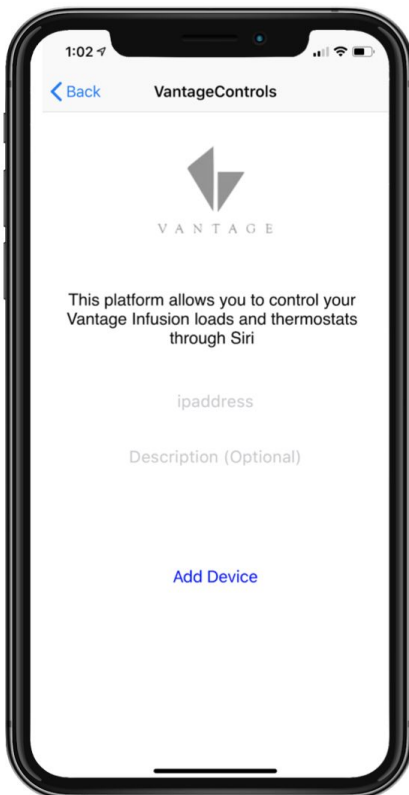
Siri and Alexa Control for Vantage Infusion

About

The Smarter Home device is a standalone piece of hardware from Smarter Home that connects to your existing wifi network through the setup process on an iOS or Android device and adds voice control to your Vantage system. From the app, you can enter the IP address of your Vantage controller and the device will automatically read the loads on the controller and forward them to the Apple Home app. Additional setup provides for Alexa control.

Detailed Setup and help guide:

The Smarter Home Device connects to your wireless network and allows you to communicate with Vantage using Siri and Alexa. Limit of 150 VIDs per Smarter Home Device

Setup Guide

1. Plug your smarter home device to power
2. Download the app
 1. [iOS](#)
 2. [Android](#)
3. Follow the setup steps in the app to connect to your local network
4. Once connected, click the + icon in the top right and select vantage
 1. Enter your vantage IP address
 2. Optional: Range of VIDs to be read in and/or VIDs to be omitted
5. Once added, you can open the [apple home app](#) to begin interacting using Siri

To enable Alexa:

After adding the Vantage accessory using the steps (1-4) above:

1. Select the Alexa accessory in the Smarter home app and follow the steps in the app to install
2. Once added, open the Alexa app and search for devices

Scenes and timers can not be imported from Vantage, but can be created through the Apple home and Alexa apps
