

## What you'll need

- $9^{\prime \prime} \times 7^{\prime \prime}$ or larger 14 count Aida cloth
- Embroidery hoop
- Tapestry needle or similar
- Scissors
- DMC 6 strand embroidery floss


## Tips for Stitching

- Use two strands of thread.
- Don't knot your thread to anchor it, your stitches will do that for you.
- Use pins to place your pattern and to keep track of the pattern as you jump to different sections.
- Always make your stitches in the same direction, either left over right or right over left.
- For rows with multiple stitches of the same color, make a row of half stitches $\backslash \backslash \backslash$ first, then go back and complete the Xs with / / / stitches
- When you're finished, dampen the cloth and iron it before you display it.
