4 STYLING AND MAKE-UP



With a story paying homage to ancient Egypt, the visuals of the characters demands excellence, particularly with the make-up.

7 POST-PRODUCTION SPECIAL EFFECTS & EDITING



When all the pieces are assembled, the postproduction team bring together the final product.

8 THE FINAL PRODUCT



Once this has all been finished and double checked, the film is complete.

PROCESS A behind-the-scenes look at how Spirit of the Pharaoh came to life.

Script



After a story is outlined, the writer assembles a script. Unusually, this project was first written as a screenplay then divided into four parts. After a few drafts, this was then given over to the artist.

Thumbnails



Small sketches that are created in order to work out the page layouts and pacing of the Graphic Novel.

Pencils



Once the Thumbnails are finalised, the pages are pencil-drawn in the more traditional way that comics are drawn. Most of the key decisions are made at this stage, making the next steps of the process easier.

As with the previous steps, the pages are reviewed and some changes made if needed.





Letters

Before moving to inks, the lettering is done in order to ensure everything is proceeding as planned.


Again, the story is reviewed, and some changes are made. Some in the script, some in the art.

Inks

This section of the process embelishes the pencils, defining areas of black, and making sure that each panel is readable.

In the more recent digital age, this part can be skipped over as modern printing technology means the need for the art to be photographed in Black Ink is no longer a necessity.

However, for the classic look required for Spirit of the Pharaoh, this was the better way to go.
