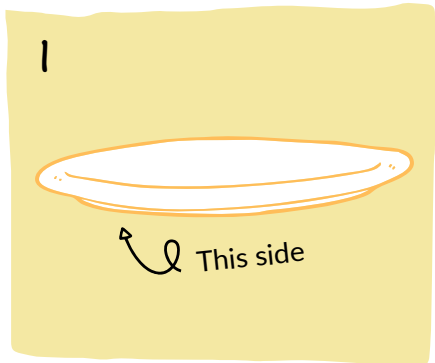


# Paper Plate Moon Craft

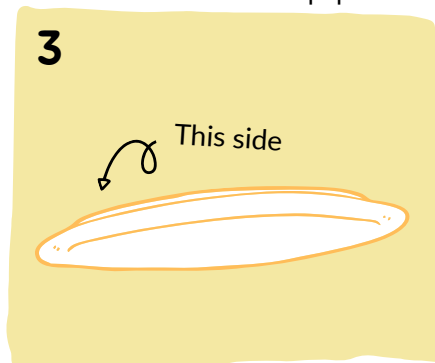
Did you know that the moon doesn't have any light of its own? We can only see the moon because of the light from the sun. And sometimes when the sun lights up the whole moon, we can see the full, bright moon shining up in the sky. But on other days, the sun only lights up a part of the moon. What kind of moon can you see today?



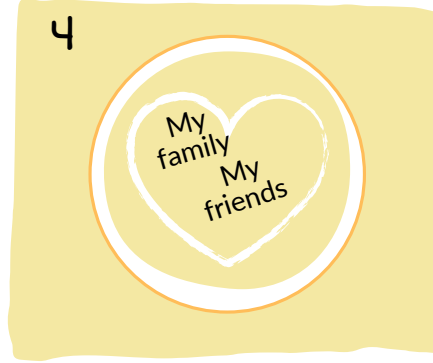
1  
To make your paper plate moon craft, paint a plain paper plate yellow and let dry. If you don't have a paper plate, just trace a circle on card paper.



2  
Cut out the moon goddess Cháng'è and the Jade Rabbit characters and stick it on the plate.



3  
Turn over your paper plate. Draw a big heart on the "crater" part of the plate.



4  
Inside the heart, write or draw all the things in your life that you are thankful for.

Done? You can also make your own binoculars to look up at the moon.

1. You will need 2 toilet rolls, some tape, felt markers, stickers, hole punch and some string.

2. Attach the 2 toilet rolls together in the shape of binoculars with the tape. Punch 2 holes on the sides using the hole punch.

3. Tie the string through the holes. Decorate the binoculars with markers and stickers. Enjoy!
