### **HOW TO DETERMINE YOUR RING SIZE**

Ring sizing can be hard to do at home. My first option to get an accurate ring measurement is to go to a local jeweler and have your ring sized by an expert. If that's not possible, I created this pdf to help you navigate ring sizing.

Please keep in mind that rings that have gemstones all around it or rings with a carved design or pattern all around (like the romanesque bands) are not resizable.

# \*\*\*BEFORE MEASURING - CONFIRM PRINTED PAPER SIZE \*\*\*

- 1. Ring measurements are very precise. Carefully follow these instructions to obtain an accurate measurement.
- 2. Prior to printing, ensure that *Page Scaling* is set to "None" on your print dialog box.
- 3. Measure the bar on the left. It must be exactly 1 inch or 30 mm long. Alternately, place a quarter where indicated. The quarter should fit completely over the image so that all lines are covered, without the quarter hanging over any edges.

### **MEASURE AN EXISTING RING**

- Select a ring that properly fits the intended finger. (Engagement and wedding rings are traditionally worn on the ring finger on the left hand in the United States.)
- 2. Place the ring over the circles below, matching the inside edge of the ring to the circle nearest in size. This measurement refers to the inside diameter of the ring.
- 3. If the ring falls between two sizes, order the larger size.



Measurements match the **inside** edge of the ring.
