




## SOLAR ECLIPSE FLIP BOOK DIRECTIONS

**TO ASSEMBLE:** First, photocopy the pages onto card stock and cut out on dark lines. Card stock is recommended because it gives enough weight to the pages to flip correctly. Printer paper will not work by itself. Place pages in order and then staple the left hand side. **ALTERNATIVE:** Photocopy onto printer paper. Cut out and paste onto 3" x 5" index cards.


**TO USE:** Hold the stapled edge and **SLOWLY** flip the edges to watch the solar eclipse.
