
LOG CABIN BLOCK

UNFINISHED BLOCK SIZE 8½" X 8½"

The Log Cabin block has been around since the mid-19th century, originating in England and Ireland. Symbolic of home and hearth, each block typically has a light and dark side to represent the sun's movement from morning to night with the blocks center traditionally done in a shade of red that represents the heart of the home.

(1) 1½" x 4½"
Color E (1) 1½" x 5½"



Use only one color for all of Group 1. Arrange Group 2 from light to dark.




Arrange both groups 1 & 2 from light to dark.




Arrange Group 1 from dark to light and Group 2 from light to dark.

block construction

Starting with the center square, sew pieces together in a clockwise direction as shown below. Use a 1/4" seam allowance for all piecing. Press seams open as you go. Unfinished block should measure $8^{1}/_{2}$ " x $8^{1}/_{2}$ ".











2. Sew Color A $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " to the unit.




3. Sew Color D 11/2" $x 3\frac{1}{2}$ " to the unit.

5. Sew Color B 11/2" x 41/2" to the unit.


6. Sew Color B 1½" x 5½" to the unit.



7. Sew Color E 11/2" x 51/2" to the unit.

8. Sew Color E 11/2" x 61/2" to the unit.

9. Sew Color C 11/2" x 61/2" to the unit.



10. Sew Color C 11/2" x 71/2" to the unit.

11. Sew Color F 1½" x 7½" to the unit.

12. Sew Color F 1½" x 8½" to the unit.
