The Kips Bay Show House, a timeless institution in New York 48 years in the running, has returned to Palm Beach for its third annual Floridian iteration. The 8,751-square-foot home, located in West Palm Beach's picturesque South End neighborhood, was designed to embrace the subtropical climate, blending indoor and outdoor spaces. Completely transformed by 19 renowned design firms from all across the country, the show house's interiors evoke the exotic and luxurious South Florida lifestyle. Jonathan Savage's pool pavilion

Nashville-based designer Jonathan Savage created a pool-adjacent outdoor living space filled with Indonesian teaks, luxurious fabrics, and exotic woods inspired by his travels in the French West Indies. Sutherland's Continuous Line Lounge Chair encourages guests to indulge in a little idle time after a dip in the pool. Fine art photography of Nantucket and Palm Beach by Nathan Coe hangs on the cabana walls. A pair of teak louvered dividers provide a little enclosure, while the ceiling of the cabana pavilion is painted blue in a nod to Savage's southern heritage.
