SUTHERLAND By choosing to develop furniture from an architectural perspective, Vincent van Duysen in his 'Franck' collection for Sutherland Furniture creates a series of spatial relations rather than simple shapes. Van Duysen's goal is to grant soul and personality to spaces in which to live well and relate to others, amid warmth, beauty and tranquillity.

His architectural language doesn't cater to fashions or trends, giving each piece a purity and timelessness. Functionality, durability and comfort are combined with refined details and precise craftsmanship. Furthermore, 'Franck' tables are available with Van Duysen's trademark Belgian Bluestone tops. The collection also showcases Sutherland's performance properties, for example an innovative dual-movable back chaise with integrated side table. Van Duysen is a distinguished AD100 designer, and Sutherland's collaboration with him maintains its history of partnering with leaders in the field.

Van Duysen is quite candid about his inspiration – the work of French interior decorator Jean-Michel Frank. "The pure and essential but, at the same time, very elegant and sensual language of the 1930s is a reference we use very often in our interior projects," he explains. "I want to create simple, timeless and refined objects that fit both classic and modern environments. Sutherland has the ability to translate this idea of a domestic interior feeling to the outdoor environment, which I very much admire" ■
