## Size Guide

## Ring Sizer Cut-Out

Before you begin, use a ruler to ensure that the line in the reference to the right has been printed to 100 mm . Remember to measure your ring size when your hands are warm, as this yields the most precise results.

Strengthen the ring sizer by placing a single layer of clear tape over it, before cutting around the edges. Use a sharp knife to then carefully cut the vertical slit.


With the logo facing outwards, wrap the ring sizer around the widest point of your finger (typically the knuckle). Pull the narrow end of the ring sizer through the slit, and tighten until it fits snugly around your finger. Your ring size is the letter that lines up with the slit. Opt for the larger size if yours sits between two letters. In any case, the ring sizer should be able to slide over the knuckle.

## Using An Existing Ring

If you currently own a well-fitting ring and wish to determine its size, position it over the circles until you find a suitable match.


Note: Opt for the larger size if it is between letters.

## 4. Printing This Page Information

Note that to obtain an accurate ring size, it's necessary to print this page at $100 \%$. The "fit to page" option must be unchecked in your printer options, and page scaling should be set to actual size or 100\%. Check that the 100mm line featured on this page is accurate. Do not measure from this page on a digital device.

All ring sizes determined through this guide are approximate. York Jewellers are happy to make sizing adjustments if needed.
