## Modernity, the self, and sex

Mark Regnerus's Cheap Sex: The Transformation of Men, Marriage, and Monogamy\* (2017) is published by Oxford University Press. His earlier book, Premarital Sex in America: How Young Americans Meet, Mate, and Think about Marrying\* (2011), was co-written with Jeremy Uecker and was published by Oxford. Anthony Giddens's *The Transformation of Intimacy*: Sexuality, Love & Eroticism in Modern Societies\* (1992) was published by Stanford University Press. Regnerus writes that his own book is, in a sense, a book about Giddens's book. See also Giddens's Modernity and Self-Identity: Self and Society in the Late Modern Age\* (Stanford, 1991), in which Giddens develops the distinctively modern experience of a "pure relationship," a relationship "in which external criteria have become dissolved: the relationship exists solely for whatever rewards that relationship as such can deliver." Margaret Archer's observations about *Homo* inconstantus — serially reinvented man — is from her article "'Caritas in Veritate' and Social Love," published in International Journal of Public Theology 5 (2011). Archer argues that defective models of personal identity have dominated social theory since the Enlightenment, but that the centrality of love in Catholic social teaching offers an alternative understanding of human identity.
