THE BASIC RULES OF THE GAME



MAGIC WINNING NUMBER*

*OR HOWEVER YOU CHOOSE TO PLAY

Shuffleboard requires 2 teams. You can play as singles or doubles.

In doubles, one person from each team stands at either end of the lane. In singles, both players will start on the same end of the lane and walk back and forth each frame. Two frames complete a round.

In each frame, opponents alternate shooting each of the eight discs. Red shoots first in both frames of the first round. Black shoots first in both frames of the second round. Continue alternating which color starts each frame of each round.

All four discs are played from the "head" of the court, beginning inside the 10-Off area, also known as the kitchen.

Players must not step onto the lane while shooting.

To score points, a disc must stop completely within the numbered scoring area (OR you can choose to score point when a majority of the disc is within the scoring area - reccomended for beginners). Discs touching a line are not counted. Discs within the 10-Off area count as negative 10 points.

Discs that don't cross both "foul" lines in the center of the board should be cleared before the next disc is shot.

Play to 75 to complete a game. Or play any number of rounds (such as 5), or to any number of your choosing.
