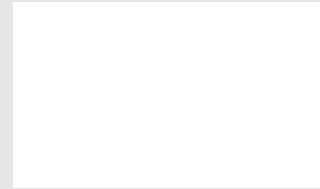

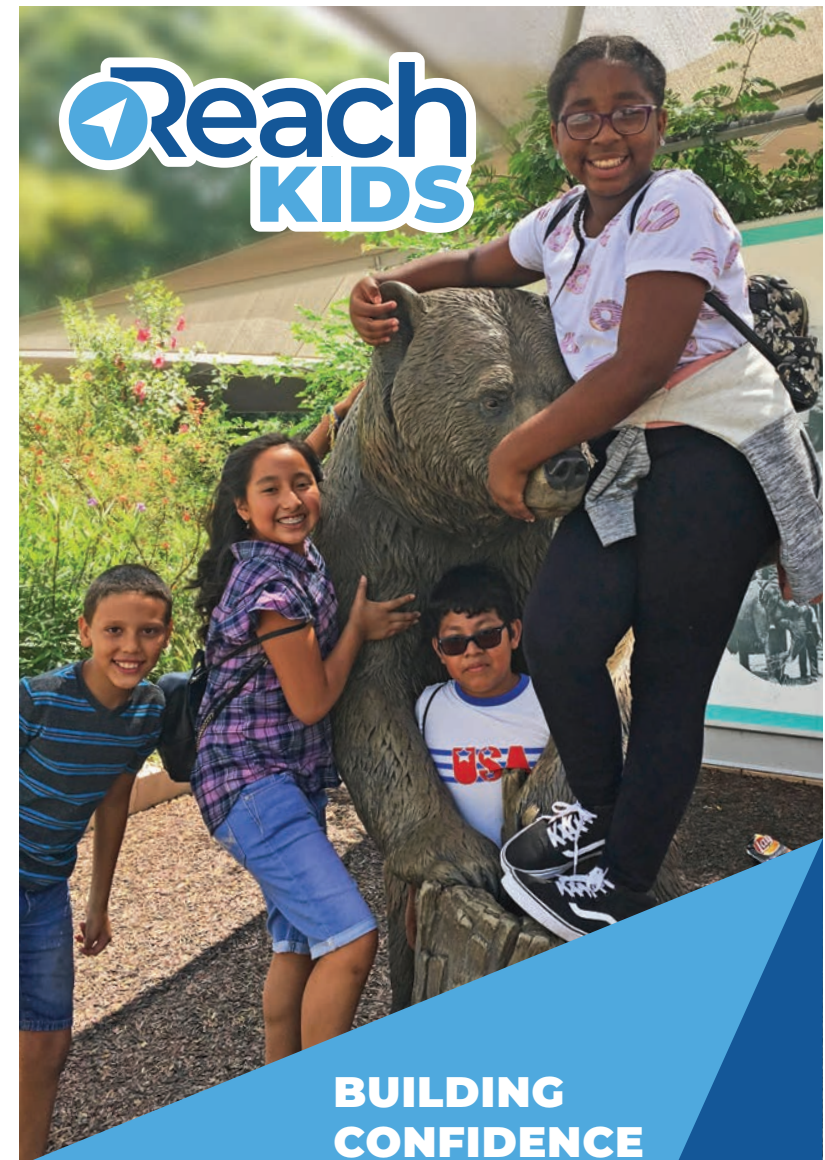

What is REACH?

Jamboree is committed to the long-term success of our residents and their children across California, so our housing includes quality services customized to enrich their lives. This approach to our resident services is called REACH. For Jamboree kids, our after-school programs help them REACH their full potential to build confidence for life.

Why REACH Works

Focused on solutions

In California, thousands of kids pre-K through 12th grade are currently homeless or living in an unstable housing situation. These students are at greater risk of falling behind in the classroom due to higher stress and anxiety, limited quiet space to work on homework at night, and having to start over at a new school each time their family moves.



Focused on success

After-school and summer programs offer academic assistance that improves school attendance and performance, provided by caring role models who help them envision a different future.* Current research also shows that, for most kids, a strong predictor of academic success is the ability to handle their own emotions and behavior. This leads to success in personal relationships, work and life.

REACH creates a safe environment where kids can learn, play and ultimately reach their full potential.

Each kid has a chance to talk about a time when he or she was wronged or wronged someone else, and consider feelings and responses. A local folk music center field trip provides kids with an opportunity to try various instruments: drums from around the world, string instruments, chimes, keyboards, and sing along with folk tunes.	In a leadership program, students work together to create goals, assign responsibilities, create an attendance and performance chart, and work in groups to create program guidelines.	Movie-making and creative presentations empower kids to share about family, values, school, hobbies, memories, and the future through public speaking.
