IMPORTANT: WHEN DOING ANY ADJUSTMENTS, DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN THE #13 & #10 SET SCREWS! DOING SO WILL CAUSE BINDING IN THE GAUGE

ADJUSTING BLADE FLUSH TO WEAR PLATE

Your Wood Sabre has been calibrated at the factory before shipping. However, if you do find it necessary to adjust the blade, it is a simple process.


With a 5/64" hex key, loosen the set screw on the spring retainer (#14). While holding the gauge at "0" on the sight window either advance or retract the detent ball mount (#17) in relation to the Spring Retainer (#14) to adjust the Blade (#2) flush with the wear plate (#6). Retighten the Set Screw (#13). **DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN SET SCREW #13 AS THIS WILL CAUSE BINDING.**

DIALING IN YOUR WOOD SABRE MARKING GAUGE

The Adjustment Shaft is detented at 1/2" increments. For measurements in between, you can precisely dial in your setting.

For example: For a 3/4" scribe, loosen the Shaft Locking Knob (#8), slide the Adjustment Shaft (#5) forward to the nearest 1/2" **under** your final desired setting. Rotate the knurled Spindle (#14, 17). Every complete rotation =1/16". In order to advance the blade 1/4" to reach the 3/4" setting, rotate the spindle 4 complete revolutions aligning the "0" marks on the Graduated Tube (#11) and the marking Gauge Body (#9). (Notice as you rotate the spindle the sight window on the gauge body has as scale at 1/16" increments). This scale should now be at 1/4". So, to reach the 3/4" setting, we have 1/2" on the adjustment shaft + 1/4" dialed in = 3/4". You are ready to scribe a 3/4" line.
