
Synthesizing ideas across sources requires two separate steps, and this poster accounts for both. STEP 1: Collect relevant textual details on sticky notes while keeping source-specific information organized. STEP 2: Read through all of the details and group similar ones to generate new and bigger thoughts; note these syntheses within the ba-bam bubbles to the right.



Inference Poster

TOOLS FOR TEACHING



After reading literature or informational text, it's common to have students generate a written response. These complex tasks are presented as an extended-response writing and follow a predictable structure. The Writing-About-Reading Frames include over two dozen typical prompts seen on standardized assessments. Organized by Narrative Writing, Literary Analysis, and Research Writing, teachers can plug in any title, author, concept, or plot information to generate a persuasive, argumentative, informative, or narrative response.



Serving Up Synthesis Set

The synthesizing process is like baking a cake. Readers have to add multiple ingredients (additional thoughts) to the powdered cake mix (the original text) in order to produce a cake (achieve a new understanding or realization). Teach this process explicitly.

- 1) Introduce the six "ingredients" to consider when reading any text background knowledge, setting/context, emotional reaction, other viewpoints, genre considerations, lingering questions. Represent each type of thought with a labeled spoon.
- 2) Read a powerful excerpt/text.
- 3) Holding up one spoon at a time, ask questions from the colorcoordinated recipe cards.
- 4) Using the seventh recipe card, show students how to add up their thoughts, thinking beyond the text's meaning and considering why it matters. The seventh recipe card includes "baking time" questions to help students achieve a culminating synthesis.

A student's level of engagement falls when he is stationary and silent. This is when learning stalls. However, the intentional and frequent use of physical movement, peer conversations, and classroom space all activate and stimulate student thinking. 
