### **PREPARE**

- Make an **Emergency Plan:** Set a plan with your family to know how to contact one another and reconnect if separated. Keep an **Emergency Supply Kit** in your home and an **Emergency** Car Kit in your vehicle. It's essential to have essential items if traveling is necessary. 72HRS offers various Emergency Kits.
- Clean leaves, garbage, ice, and other debris away from storm drains near your home.
- Ensure you have **light** sources readily available. Keep a flashlight in an easily accessible place in case of a power outage. Having at least one Hand-crank Flashlight in your house is a good idea as it does not rely on batteries.
- Obtain **home insurance** with flood coverage.

Choose one that best suits your needs.

Seal basement windows and the base of ground-level doors. Add window wells and covers to windows near or below ground level.

## **AFTER**

- Follow directions from **local authorities** and **first responder personnel**.
- Maintain good hygiene during flood cleanup by minimizing contact with floodwater or anything that may have come in contact with it.
- Wear protective clothing, including rubber boots or sturdy boots, safety glasses, a hard hat, rubber gloves, and a dust mask.
- Check with local authorities or community leaders on how to properly dispose of damaged items from your home.
- Do not use any appliances, heating, pressure, or sewage system until electrical components are dry and have been inspected by a qualified electrician.

## **DURING**

- Pay attention to weather statements broadcasted by radio and television stations. Keep a NOAA radio in your emergency kit.
- When a flood or flash flood warning is issued for your area, head for higher ground and stay there.
- Avoid walking and driving through flooded waters as they could be deeper than you think.
- Be especially **cautious at night** when it is harder to recognize flood danger.
- Keep children and pets away from floodwater.

#### **IMPORTANT FACTS**

- The best time to prepare for any disaster is before it happens.
- Be prepared to leave at a moment's notice.
- Turn Around, Don't Drown! Just six inches of moving water can knock you down.
- Avoid bridges and fast-moving water.
