

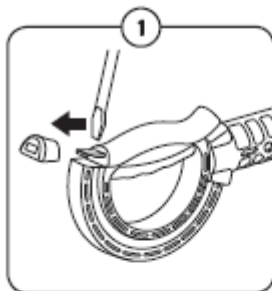
Maintenance and Cleaning

As with any tools looking after them will ensure they continue to run smoothly year after year.

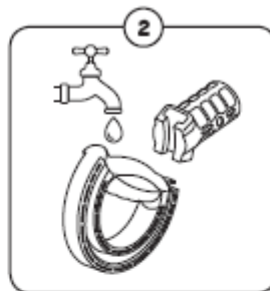
We've made taking the D part off the connector easier so now can be removed using forefinger and thumb instead of a screw driver.

The blend of Polymers used in making ITip handles does include lubricant but it is beneficial to occasionally apply a light spray of something like silicone spray or WD 40 to help keep things sliding smoothly, especially if they've been in dusty or dirty environments.

There's no need to take them off to lubricate, only if seriously caked in muck and needing a wash off first.



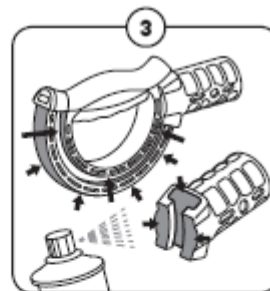
If the track on the handles becomes clogged up with debris, simply pop off the track closure cap to clean



If really dirty - as in missed the barrow with a shovel full of rubble type of dirty - the handles may become jammed.

In which case it's best to get a hose or run under them tap. You may need to gently knock/tap them round if stuck fast.

They will soon clear and after a few goes will be back as good as new.



A light spraying on the shaded areas with furniture polish, oil or silicone spray will help keep things running smoothly

Take care not to spray the part of the handle you hold.
Remove any excess lubricant with a cloth
