


PICTURE SEQUENCING AND TEACHING PROGRAM


- This set of tasks includes materials for teaching basic sequencing of pictures and beginning to tell a story from the sequence.
- The materials can be used for:
 - Independent work tasks (Velcro them onto the sequencing boards)
 - Direct instruction or discrete trials of sequencing skills (program and data sheet included)
 - Table tasks to help students engage independently in a group

WHAT'S INCLUDED?

SEQUENCING BOARDS:

Sequencing boards are included to help students know where to put the pictures in order. They are also useful to use with Velcro on the pictures and the boards so that the work stays together during independent work. Print as many as you need for sequences. You can reuse them or print one for each series depending on your need.





INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM & DATA SHEET

I've included a data sheet that has steps for teaching students to sequence pictures. It starts with 2 step sequences and increases to 4 picture sequences with the student telling you what is happening in the story.

Sequencing is both a language and a reading skill. Students are expected to pick up on elements in the pictures to tell them the order.

Within the program, be sure to mix up the series you present so that students don't simply memorize that particular series. This may take longer to get to mastery, but will lead to better maintenance and generalization.



How I Use It

You can use these materials for discrete trials, for students who cannot currently sequence. And you can use them in independent work systems once the students are able to sequence up to 4-step sequences.

I've included a discrete trial teaching program with the steps for presenting the skills. The sheet also allows you to take data on each trial and graph the data immediately. This saves a step of having to graph the data at a later time and lets you see the student's progress or problems more quickly.

The materials are designed to be used in order with students increasing their difficulty from simple 2-step sequences to 4-step sequences that they describe. This helps to build their language skills into reading skills. There are also 6 sequences that have written text if you want to begin students pairing text with the pictures.

I've created a video that walks you through the teaching program and the data sheet.

You are welcome to share the video with others in your classroom or on your caseload implementing this program with your students (e.g. paraprofessionals, related service providers).
