10 PowerPoint or Google Slides that each include a basic put-in task. These tasks are often the first skills our students work on when using an independent work system. They simply involve moving items onto or into (behind) a container.

- The tasks are simple with visual and written directions.
- They can be completed using touch and drag on a tablet or using a mouse or touchpad on a computer
- You can also modify them to meet your students needs by removing the number of manipulatives. (see next page for directions)
- 4 of the tasks (piggy bank, buttons, pencils, and candles) have containers the students put the items "into" which, in the digital world means they go behind the container and disappear.
  - If your items get rearranged on the page, right click on the container and choose "Move to Front" to make it work that way again.


Put the blocks in the bin.

The remaining tasks have students put the item on top of the container. These should remain stable.






With the cup set as the front layer, students will move the buttons and they will go behind the cup, looking as if they have been put in the cup.


Students will put the blocks on bin so they will look like they are in the bin.





