This set is designed to go with my Sight Word Food Task Cards and includes the same words as that set. It's designed to teach students to hear the words and find the words, whether in a BINGO game or just for I-I practice.

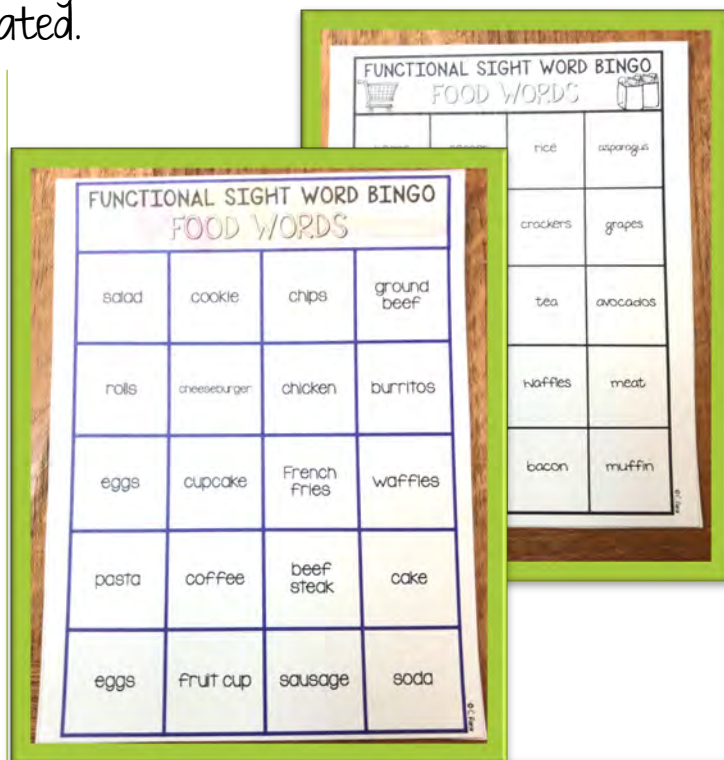
FOOD WORDS BINGO

What's Included?

There are 2 levels of BINGO included. Each are included in color and black and-white. 102 Words found in grocery stores, menus, and restaurants are included with some words repeated.

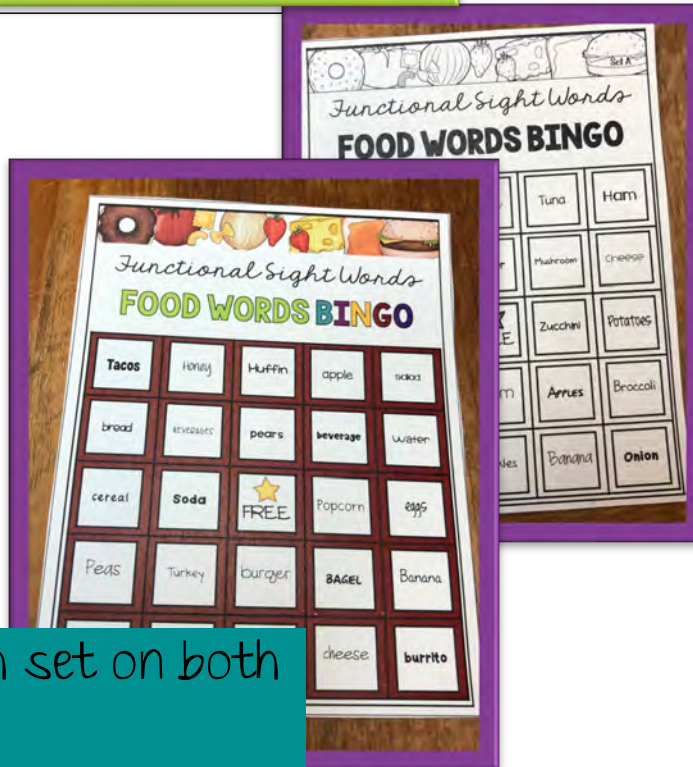
LEVEL 1

- 6 sets of words
- 5 cards per set
- 30 total BINGO cards
- 20 words per card
- All lowercase
- All the words on a card are the same font
- Color cards are color coded by sets of words
- Each set of cards has a different font to tell them apart.



LEVEL 2

- 5 sets of words
- 5 cards per set
- 25 total BINGO cards
- 25 words per card
- Lowercase & uppercase
- Different fonts are used within each card
- Color cards are color coded by sets of words
- Black & White are labeled set A-E in top right corner



Calling cards are included with each set on both levels

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How I Use Them

There are multiple ways you can use BINGO cards in the classroom to support practice with reading comprehension of environmental print.

1. Play BINGO

I know that one seems obvious, but it's a great small group activity. Choose the level you want to play and you can have up to 5 students play at once. Use bingo chips or put the cards in dry erase envelopes or page protectors and use dry erase markers to cross out the words as they are called.

If playing BINGO it's best to play for 1 row horizontal, vertical or diagonal to have just 1 winner. If you want all the students to win, play Blackout as each set of cards have the same words. If you want them to play blackout but not all win, let me know and I'll add some cards.

2. Independent Work or Table Tasks (Matching)

The cards can be used in independent work by making copies of the card (laminating if desired), putting Velcro on the words. Then make a copy and cut out the calling cards, laminate and Velcro. Then have the student match the calling cards to the words on the card in their work system.

3. Student-to-Student Practice

You could use them with peer buddies or have your students work together in pairs. One student reads off the calling cards and the other finds the words on the BINGO card. This gives both students practice in learning the words.
