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LIBRARY READ-ALOUD BOOK CLUB AND ADVENTURERS' PASSPORT

HOW IT WORKS:

The club is for adventurers of all ages and works best with groups of 5-20 club members at each meeting. The club runs from September through May, so a total of 9 books will be read throughout the course of the club.

The librarian or library staff member will select a *Choose* Your *Own Adventure*® book to read each month, and the adventurers decide which path the group should take. If the group can't agree, roll a die! If it lands on an even number, do choice A; odd number, do choice B.

The adventurers really enjoy choosing what we do, and a lot of time they end up checking out the book so they can continue their adventures. After reading the book, do a couple activities inspired by the book. We've included a list of sample activities to choose from, but this can be a jumping off point.

At the beginning of the 9-month Read-Aloud Book Club, print out "Adventurers' Passports" for each club member. As they participate each month, they will earn a book badge to glue in. If the adventurer completes the passport, they will receive a special package from the publisher of stickers, pens, bookmarks, and a free CYOA book of their choosing.
