## Extending Learning After Screens In partnership with OSMO

- Use the Letter shapes in play to form letters with paint or a sand tray. The letter shapes are a great way of exploring making new letters and talking about straight and curvy lines
- Use the letter tiles from Words game to build names of friends and family members. Try missing out key letters for them to identify and locate
- Trace around the Tangrams shapes to create your own game, can your child correctly identify them and match them? They might want to do this for you too!
- Add the number tiles to a bag or box to pull out randomly to make your own game. The first one to move their toy to number 20 is the winner!
- Draw key items from the Costume pieces onto paper or bottle tops for your little one to practise creating their own stories. This is a fun alternative for bedtime!
- After colouring in some of the outlines on Masterpiece, why not create your own by drawing around your child on a roll of paper and encouraging them to decorate it?
- Use the Squiggle pieces pressed into play dough to create your own pictures!
